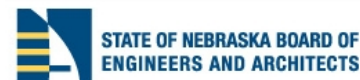

Driving Adoption

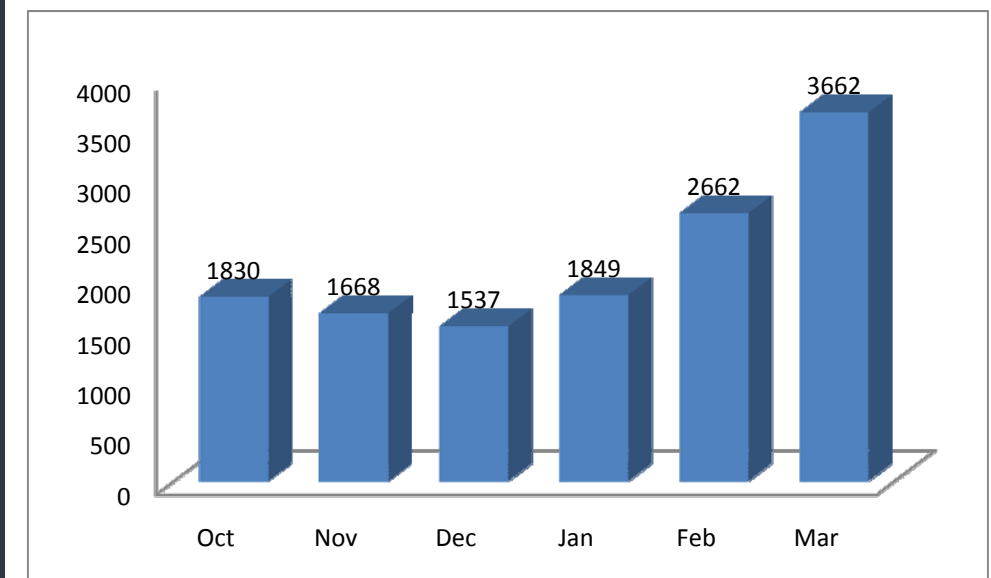
Court eFiling

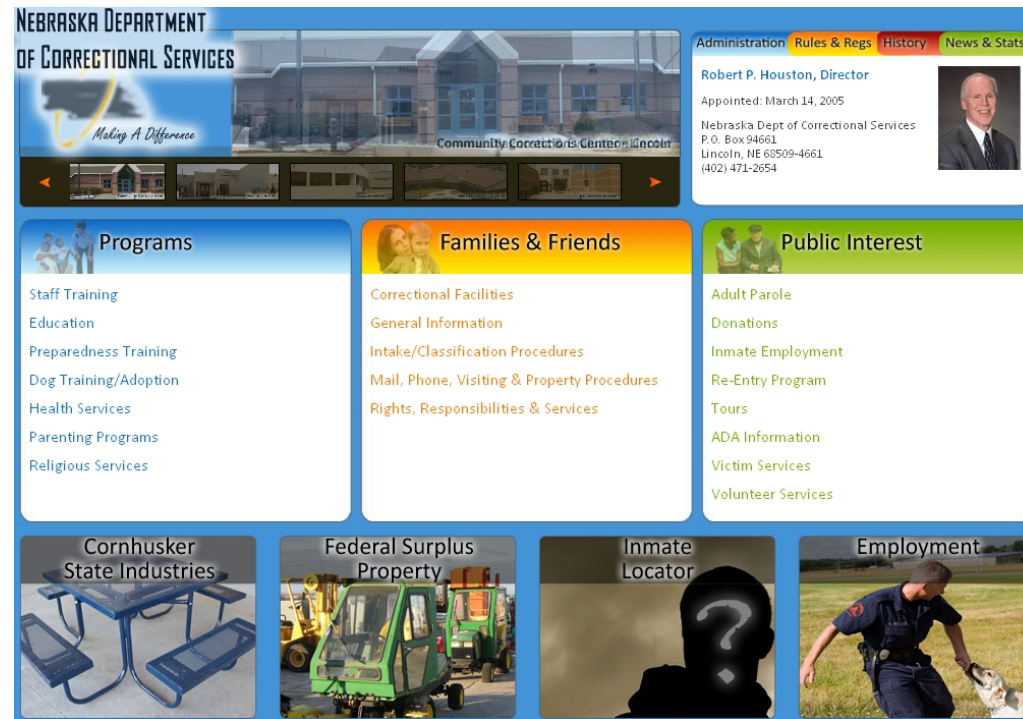

The Nebraska Department of Correctional Services has worked with Nebraska.gov to design a new website. The new site makes it easy to find information.

One of the sections provides information for families and friends of inmates, such as facility information, procedures for intake, mail, phone, visiting and property.

The site also provides information for the general public. If someone was interested in the re-entry program or hiring ex-inmates, there is access to that information on the new site.

Another feature is the Cornhusker State Industries (CSI.) This section gives people the opportunity to order products that have been made by inmates within the Nebraska state correctional facilities. There is a variety of products available including chairs, filing cabinets and picnic tables just to name a few.

The driver license practice test is now available and free for download at the iTunes Store. With the "Nebraska Driver License Practice Test," Nebraska is among the first states to utilize the technology of the new iPad.

"By offering the driver license practice test, on one of the newest and innovative new tools, Nebraska continues to lead the way in using technology to serve our citizens," said Beverly Neth, Director of the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles. "We are thrilled to be the first agency in Nebraska to use this new method to reach people."

By using the practice test, new drivers are able to prepare for the written test, one of the requirements needed to receive a driver license. It is also a great tool for those new to the state and those that want a refresher on the rules of the road.
