

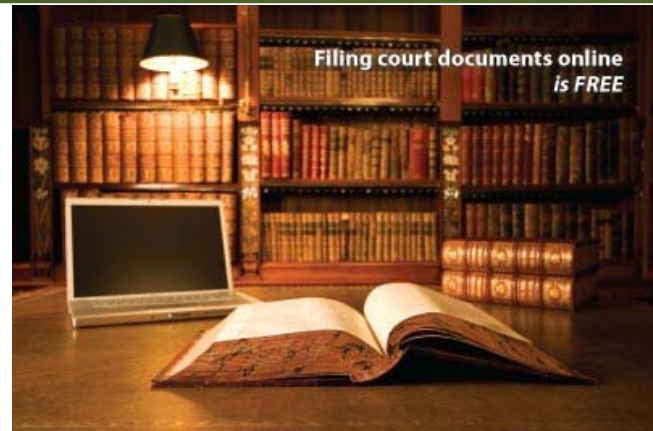

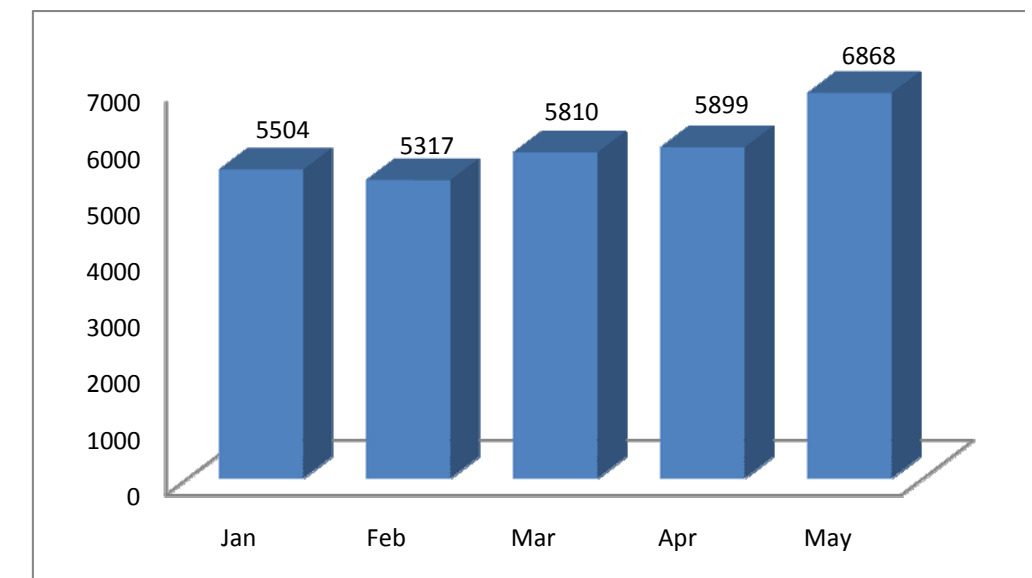
License Plate Renewals

A record number of license plates were renewed in May, using the online system.

With the attention brought to the newest additions to the services available online through the Department of Motor Vehicles, there has been an increase of online license plate renewals. The newest additions include Driver License renewals and State ID renewals, along with duplicates.

From January 1, 2010 to May 31, 2010, Nebraska.gov has collected and deposited over \$4.7 million dollars on behalf of the County Treasurers. This has saved numerous staff hours, in time spent at the counter, as well as balancing the money collected.

Newest addition to Nebraska.gov portal

- State Data Files**: Download and mashup using state data in CSV, KML and XLS formats.
- State Data Sources**: Larger sources of state data which allow you to access, query and download in dozens of categories.
- State Databases**: State data which allow you to search in dozens of categories.
- Federal Data**: Federal repository of data sources which allow you to access, query and download in dozens of categories.
- Geographic Data**: KML files can be used to create maps with popular mapping tools. See some examples.
- Non-Government Data**: Nebraska data is also available from external sources.

The newest addition to the Nebraska.gov portal is now available.

The "My Data" section of the portal gives people the opportunity to search and view data all in one place. There are six different sections:

- State Data Files
- State Data Sources
- State Databases
- Federal Data
- Geographic Data
- Non-Government Data
