Nebraska.gov has partnered with GovDelivery to deliver an easy way to communicate. This system was designed to send an email or text message when an update has been made to your website. You can set it up to automatically send to people, or an administrator can review and approve a message prior to it being delivered.

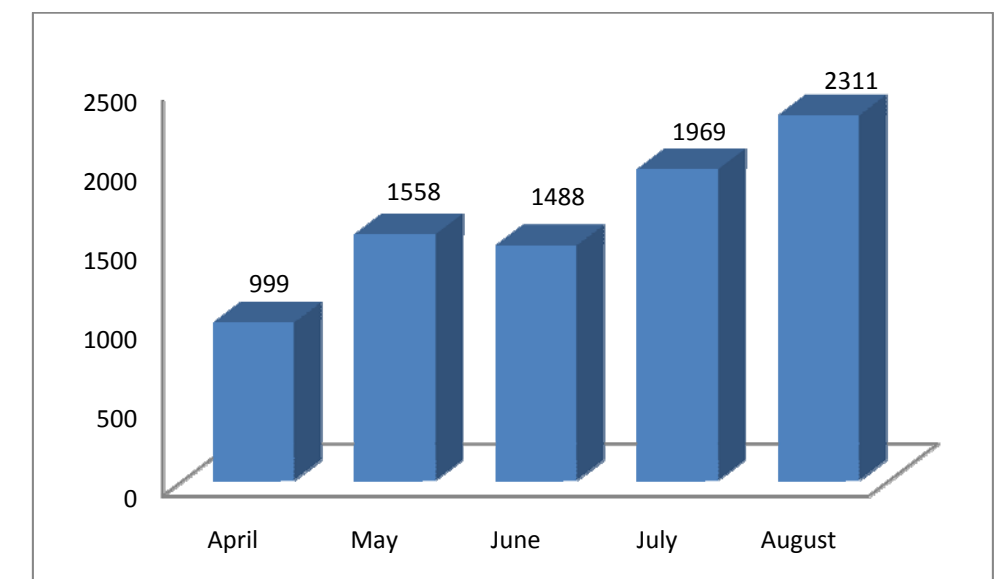
Driver License Renewals

Starting this spring, Nebraskans have been given the option to renew their Driver License using a new online service.

Posters were created and have been distributed to every driver examiner office in the state, as well as the county treasurers. The posters list some of the other services available online. Other marketing methods include a message on the renewal notice letter, as well as inserts in all mailings sent by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Citizens are also able to order a duplicate driver license, in addition to the renewal and duplicate of State Identification cards.

LiveWell Survey



The LiveWell survey was developed in response to a search for a quality, scientifically sound health risk assessment. The State of Nebraska wanted a survey that was backed up and benchmarked with the Center for Disease Control's Behavior Risk Factor Surveillance System, or BRFSS, the largest survey instrument in the world.

The survey takes approximately 15 minutes to complete, and each employee receives an individual report giving them tips on where they can improve in leading a healthy lifestyle, as well as highlighting those areas where they are doing well. The company then receives aggregate and benchmark reports that help them to most effectively target their wellness programs/resources. All reports are HIPAA compliant.

City of Lincoln employees were the first group to participate in the newly released survey, and nearly 400 individuals completed the questionnaire and received an individual health report.

Other companies/entities that are, or will be using the LiveWell survey as a tool to encourage healthy lifestyles, and keep their insurance costs down are: Talent+, University of Nebraska Foundation, David City Public Schools, Deeter Foundry, LI-COR Biosciences, and the Nebraska Bankers Association.

This survey instrument will be marketed nationwide.
