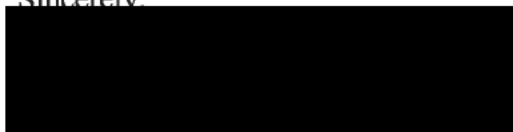
Dear Glennetta Lue-Long:

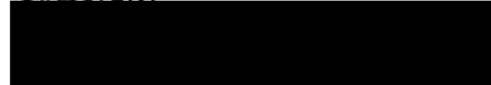

NOTICE:

Great Kids Child Care, owned by Glennetta Lue-Long (hereinafter referred to as "Great Kids") is notified that the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, (hereinafter referred to as "Department") is imposing disciplinary action against Great Kids' Operating Family Child Care Home II License for violation of the following statutes and regulations:

AUTHORITY:

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1919, of the Child Care Licensing Act provides that "the Department may ... take disciplinary action against a license issued under the Child Care Licensing Act on any of the following grounds: (1) Failure to meet or violation of any of the requirements of the Child Care Licensing Act or the rules and regulations adopted and promulgated under the act;" ...

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1920, of the Child Care Licensing Act provides that "...the Department may impose any one or a combination of the following types of disciplinary action against a license issued under the Child Care Licensing Act:

- (b) Suspend or revoke a provisional, probationary, or operating license;
- (c) Impose a civil penalty of up to five dollars per child, base on the number of children for which the program is authorized to provide child care on the effective date of the finding of violation, for each day the program is in violation." ...

391 NAC 2-008.01 Grounds for Denial or Disciplinary Action: "The Department may deny the issuance of or take disciplinary action against a license on any of the following grounds: 1. Failure to meet or violation of any of the requirements of the Child Care Licensing Act or the rules and regulations adopted and promulgated under the Act;"

391 NAC 2-006.04D Nebraska's Early Learning Guidelines Training: The primary provider must complete training in the seven domains of Nebraska's Early Childhood Learning Guidelines developed by the ECTC. Any proposed equivalent training must be approved by Department. The domains are Approaches to Learning, Creative Arts, Health and Physical Development, Language and Literacy Development, Mathematics, Science and Social and Emotional Development.

1. In programs licensed on or after the operative date of these regulations, the primary provider must complete training in one domain within four years of the date of provisional licensure and one domain annually thereafter.
2. In programs licensed before the operative date of these regulations, the primary provider must complete training in one domain within four years of that operative date and one domain annually thereafter.
3. This training counts toward the annual training requirement.

391 NAC 2-006.04E Annual Training: The primary provider and each staff member, not including substitutes or volunteers, must obtain 12 clock hours of training annually. Staff who work 20 hours or less each week must complete six hours of training annually.

FACTS AND FINDINGS:

On December 5, 2017, Michelle McClellan, Child Care Inspection Specialist, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health (hereinafter referred to as "McClellan"), conducted an unannounced annual inspection at Great Kids. Great Kids was in violation of several regulations. Great Kids was given until January 19, 2018, to correct all violations. Some of these violations have since been corrected.

On February 1, 2018, Jo Pfeiffer, Child Care Licensing Supervisor, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health (herein after referred to as "Pfeiffer"),

sent a past due letter to Great Kids. The letter informed Great Kids that all regulations need to be corrected by February 19, 2018, to avoid disciplinary action against the license.

As of August 31, 2018, the following violations found during the December 5, 2017, inspection still need to be corrected:

- Great Kids must complete one domain of the Nebraska Early Learning Guidelines Training that was due to be completed by May 20, 2017.

PREVIOUS HISTORY:

- Great Kids has not completed the required 12 hours of annual in-service training for staff for 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.
- Great Kids has not properly maintained staff records for review by the Department for 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.
- In 2016 and 2017, Great Kids was issued a Notice of Disciplinary Action resulting from noncompliance of regulations. In both cases Great Kids was assessed a civil penalty.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION IMPOSED:

Based upon the facts presented above, the Department intends to impose the following:

1. Great Kids is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$50 per day (\$5.00 times license capacity of 10 children) from the effective date of this Notice, September 18, 2018, and for each day thereafter, including Saturday and Sunday, that Great Kids fails to submit corrections/documentation that all of the outstanding non-compliances noted at the inspection conducted on December 5, 2017, have been corrected.

Documentation must be submitted to Michelle McClellan, State Office Building, 3rd Floor, 1313 Farnam St., Omaha, Nebraska, 68102, (402) 595-3345, or by email to Michele.McClellan@nebraska.gov. Once McClellan has received and verified the submitted written corrections/documentation, which may require an on-site inspection, Great Kids will be informed in writing of the total amount of the civil penalty, which will be due 30 calendar days from the date of the notification to Great Kids.

Said penalty will then be payable to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, and is to be sent to Chris Kort, PO Box 94986, Lincoln, NE 68509-4986.

2. Once Great Kids has come into compliance with all violations found during the December 5, 2017 inspection, Great Kids' Operating Family Home Care II license will be placed on probation for a period of 1 year. During the Probationary period, the following terms and conditions will apply:

- a.) Great Kids must submit a detailed written plan to complete one additional domain of the Nebraska Early Learning Guidelines Training in calendar year 2018.
- b.) Great Kids must submit verification of 12 hours of annual training for **calendar year 2017** within 30 days of the probation start date.
- c.) Great Kids must submit a detailed written plan to obtain 12 hours of annual training for 2018 within 30 days of the probation start date. This plan must show how ALL 2018 training will be completed by Nov. 1, 2018.

This training must be approved by the Early Childhood Training Center as well as the Department of Health and Human Services, as meeting the requirements for acceptable training for childcare program staff.

Prior to participating in any training, Great Kids will submit in writing, the following to the Department, in order for the Department to determine if the training meets the requirements for which it is intended: training curriculum, date and time of training, name of the training, presenter/instructor's name, and the number of hours. This training will count toward the required 12 hours of annual training.

Upon receipt of the above information, the Department will either approve or require additional information in writing from the Licensee within ten working days of the receipt of the letter requesting approval of the training. If additional information is required, Great Kids must reply with the required information within ten calendar days of notice by the Department.

Great Kids must submit verification of attendance and successful completion within fifteen calendar days after completion of the approved training.

3. Great Kids must comply with all of the terms of this Notice by submitting the required written corrections/documentation as indicated above by or on September 17, 2018.

4. Failure to comply with the terms of this disciplinary action, the applicable Child Care Regulations, and failure to correct the violations may be grounds for revocation or such other discipline as the Department may deem appropriate after notice to the licensee and an opportunity for a hearing.

5. If Great Kids discontinues the child care program for any reason, the time that Great Kids is not actively operating a licensed child care program will not count toward the probation period and any subsequent child care license issued by the Department indicating Great Kids as the licensee/director/owner shall be subject to the terms of this probation including completion of the probation period. Great Kids must notify the Department, in writing, within seven (7) working days of any period that it is not actively operating the program. Active operation is the provision of childcare for a minimum of forty (40) hours a week for fifty (50) weeks of a calendar year.

BE ADVISED:

Pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1922, this action becomes final on September 17, 2018, unless the Department receives a written request for a hearing on or before such date. The license shall continue in effect until the final order of the director if a hearing is requested. If the director does not receive such request on or before such date, the action of the Department is final.

If you decide to request a hearing, your written request for hearing must be received by the Department on or by September 17, 2018. It should be addressed to:

If you request a hearing, you will be notified of the time, date, and place of the hearing and other pertinent information, by separate notice. On the basis of such hearing, the director will affirm, modify, or rescind the determination of the Department. Be advised that pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1920, upon completion of any hearing held, the director may impose any or a combination of any of the following: probation, suspension, revocation, civil penalty, restrictions of new enrollment, restrictions or other limitations on the number of children or the ages of the children served in the program, or other restrictions or limitations on the type of service provided by the program. On the basis of the hearing, a modification by the director may include sanctions important to your program, up to and including the loss of your license.

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1911, provides that a person who has had their “**license suspended or revoked other than for nonpayment of fees shall not operate or offer to operate a program for or provide care to any number of children until the person is licensed pursuant to this action.**”

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1920 of the Child Care Licensing Act, provides that “any fine imposed and unpaid under the Child Care Licensing Act shall constitute a debt to the State of Nebraska which may be collected in the manner of a lien foreclosure or sued for and recovered in any proper form of action in the name of State of Nebraska in the district court of the county in which the program is located.” In addition, section 71-1920, (2), states that “a

person who has had a license revoked for any cause other than nonpayment of fees shall not be eligible to reapply for a license for a period of two years.”

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1923 of the Child Care Licensing Act, provides that “a licensee may voluntarily surrender the license issued under the Child Care Licensing Act at any time, except that the Department may refuse to accept a voluntary surrender of a license if the licensee is under investigation or if the Department has initiated disciplinary action against the licensee.

391 NAC 2-006.01 Licensee Qualifications and Requirements: “The Family Child Care Home II licensee must: ...7. Be in compliance with all regulations whenever any children are in care;” ...

391 NAC 2-006.04E Annual Training: “The primary provider and each staff member, not including substitutes or volunteers, must obtain 12 clock hours of training annually. Staff who work 20 hours or less each week must complete six hours of training annually.”

391 NAC 2-006.04F Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and First Aid Training: ... “2. The primary provider must maintain current CPR and First Aid training as long as the home is licensed. 3. The CPR card and documentation of First Aid training must be available upon request.”

391 NAC 2-006.05A Primary Provider and Staff: “Records for the primary provider and for all staff, except substitutes and volunteers, must include: ...6. Documentation of a criminal history record check; 7. A completed Health Information Report; and 8. Documentation of Nebraska registry checks with no adverse findings;” ...

391 NAC 2-006.06 Child’s Record: “A Child’s Record must be completed before the child’s enrollment. The record must be kept current and available for review upon request by the Department.” ...

391 NAC 2-006.11 Immunizations: “Within 30 days of a child’s enrollment, the licensee must obtain a copy of the child’s immunization record. Immunization records must be available for review upon request by the Department and updated each time the child receives additional immunizations.”

391 NAC 2-006.16 Infant/Toddler Care: “If care is provided to infants and/or toddlers, the primary provider and staff must: ... 5. Obtain and keep on file a signed and dated statement by the parent(s) that describes the formula and feeding schedule for each infant in care;” ...

391 NAC 2-006.17 Overnight Care: “If overnight care is provided, the licensee must ensure that: ... f. The extinguisher is properly maintained according to State Fire Code Regulations, 153 NAC 1.”

391 NAC 2-006.23C Fire and Tornado Safety Diagrams: “Fire and tornado safety diagrams must:

1. Show the layout of the licensed child care area(s);
2. Be prominently posted and visible;
3. Include how the evacuation of children with special needs will be conducted;
4. Include fire evacuation routes; and
5. Include tornado safety locations.”

391 NAC 2-006.23D Disaster Preparedness: “The licensee must have a written plan that addresses:

1. Evacuating and moving children to a safe location in the event of a fire, tornado, flood, or other natural or man-made disaster;
2. Notifying parents of children in care of an emergency;
3. Reunification of parents with their children in the event of an emergency that requires evacuation; and

4. How children with special needs will be safe in the event of a disaster including evacuation and reunification with the parent.”

FACTS:

On December 3, 2015, Michele McClellan (hereinafter referred to as “McClellan”), Child Care Inspection Specialist, Children’s Services Licensing, Licensure Unit, Division of Public Health, conducted an unannounced annual inspection of Lue-Long’s program. At that time, McClellan noted numerous non-compliances and required correction by January 3, 2016.

On April 14, 2016, McClellan contacted Lue-Long by telephone but there was no answer. On April 18, 2016, McClellan re-sent the compliance review to Lue-Long.

On April 21, 2016, Jo Pfeiffer, Child Care Licensing Supervisor, sent Lue-Long a letter indicating verification of compliance with regulations was required by April 28, 2016. On April 28, 2016, Lue-Long sent information to be used to determine compliance for violations; however, some of the information was not accepted as verification of compliance. The compliance review was re-sent on May 6, 2016.

As of the date of this Notice, the following regulations remain in violation:

- Documentation of 12 hours of approved annual training was not available for calendar year 2014.
- Documentation of CPR/First Aid training was not available.
- Criminal History Record check, Health Information Report and Documentation of Nebraska registry checks with no adverse findings were not available for Lue-Long and staff, Crystal.
- Child Record forms were not complete for Kay Kay, Devon, Clair and Tavonis.
- Immunization Records were not available for Clair and Tavonis.
- Signed statements by parents describing formula and feeding schedules were not available for review for Kay Kay.
- Documentation that fire extinguisher has been properly maintained was not available.
- Fire and Safety Diagrams with all elements were not available.
- A written Disaster Preparedness plan was not available.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION IMPOSED:

Based upon the facts presented above, the Department intends to impose the following:

1. Lue-Long is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$10.00 per day (\$1.00 times license capacity of 10 children) from the effective date of this Notice, June 1, 2016, and for each day thereafter, including Saturday and Sunday, that Lue-Long fails to submit written corrections/documentation that all of the outstanding non-compliances noted at the inspection conducted on December 3, 2015 have been corrected.

Documentation must be submitted to Michele McClellan, Child Care Inspection Specialist, Children’s Services Licensing, Licensure Unit, Division of Public Health, 1313 Farnam Street, Third Floor, Omaha, Nebraska, 68102. Once McClellan has received and verified the submitted written corrections/documentation, which may require an on-site inspection, Lue-Long will be informed in writing

of the total of the civil penalty, which will be due 30 calendar days from the date of the notification to Lue-Long.

Said penalty will then be payable to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health. On the basis of the hearing, a modification by the director may include sanctions important to your program, up to and including the loss of your license.

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1920 of the Child Care Licensing Act, provides that “any fine imposed and unpaid under the Child Care Licensing Act shall constitute a debt to the State of Nebraska which may be collected in the manner of a lien foreclosure or sued for and recovered in any proper form of action in the name of State of Nebraska in the district court of the county in which the program is located.”

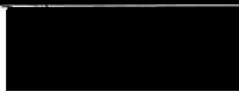
That Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1923 of the Child Care Licensing Act, provides that "a licensee may voluntarily surrender the license issued under the Child Care Licensing Act at any time, except that the Department may refuse to accept a voluntary surrender of a license if the licensee is under investigation or if the Department has initiated disciplinary action against the licensee."

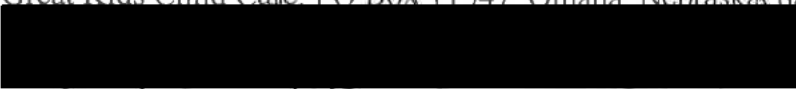
