Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71- 1911 (4), of the Child Care Licensing Act provides that the department may place a license on Corrective Action Status.....A non-disciplinary probationary license may be issued for the licensee to operate under Corrective Action Status if the department determines that:

a) The Licensee is unable to comply with all licensure requirements and standards or has had a history of noncompliance;

 The effect of noncompliance with any rule or regulation does not present an unreasonable risk to the health, safety or well-being of children or staff; and

c) The Licensee has a written plan of correction that has been approved by the department.

On October 18, 2017, Lori Pflanz, Child Care Inspection Specialist (CCIS), conducted an unannounced annual inspection. CCIS Pflanz noted a number of non-compliances at time of inspection. Non-compliances were as follows: licensee qualifications; provider records; children's records, parent information, immunization records; approved sleep surfaces for infants; fitted sheets on playpen mattresses; housekeeping and maintenance; diapering and toileting, food safety, housekeeping and maintenance, animals/pets and environmental services.

Upon review of your file it was noted that there are a number of the violations are repeat violations.

Repeat violations are:

- Health Information report –12/16/2015, 10/19/2016, 10/18/2017
- Children's Records 12/16/2015, 10/19/2016, 10/18/2017
- Not providing documentation of parent receiving handbook 12/16/2015,10/18/2017
- Immunization record unavailable on children in care 10/19/2016, 10/18/2017
- Infant and Toddler Care 12/16/2015,10/18/2017
- Proof of Liability Insurance 10/19/2016, 10/18/2017

NAC 391 2-006.01 Licensee Qualifications and Requirements: The Family Child Care Home I licensee must:

Be in compliance with all regulations whenever any children are in care;

NAC 391 2-006.02F Health Information Report: The applicant must submit a completed and signed Health Information Report on a form provided by the Department for him/herself as part of the initial application. All staff who are responsible for the care and supervision of children more than 20 hours per week must complete the report within 30 days of hiring. The Health Information Report must be completed annually.

NAC 391 2-006.06 Child's Record: A Child's Record must be completed before the child's enrollment. The record must be kept current and available for review upon request by the Department. A Child's Record form may be used or a form may be created and must contain the following information for each child:

- 1. Name of child;
- 2. Birthdate of child:
- 3. Enrollment date;
- 4. Date care ceased, if applicable;
- 5. Parent or guardian's home address and telephone number;
- 6. Parent or guardian's employment address and telephone number;
- 7. Individual(s) to whom the child may be released by the caregiver;
- 8. Individual(s) who will take responsibility for the child in an emergency when the parent or guardian cannot be reached;
- 9. Consent to contact a physician in an emergency;
- 10. Current health status of the child; and
- 11. List of child's allergies and intolerance to food, insect bites, or stings, or other factors that result in a medical reaction, and clear instructions in the event of an exposure to the factor.

NAC 391 2-006.07 Parent Information Brochure: At the time of enrollment, the licensee must give the parent(s) of each enrolled child a Parent Information Brochure provided by the Department. The licensee must keep receipts signed and dated by the parent and make them available for review by the Department.

NAC 391 2-006.11 Immunizations: Within 30 days of a child's enrollment, the licensee must obtain a copy of each enrolled child's immunization record. Immunization records must be available for review upon request by the Department and updated each time the child receives additional immunizations. Each child's immunization record must include:

1. Documentation of age-appropriate immunization;

NAC 391 2-006.16 Infant/Toddler Care: If care is provided to infants and/or toddlers, the licensee and staff must: ...

5. Obtain and keep on file a signed and dated statement by the parent(s) that describes the formula and feeding schedule for each infant in care;

Neb. Rev. Stat 71-1911.03 Proof of Liability Insurance

Based on the facts presented above and the regulations violated, the department is placing your operating license on Corrective Action Status for a period of six (6) months.

Corrective Action Status is voluntary and the decision regarding placement on Corrective Action Status is not appealable. However, you are required to submit a written Plan of Correction that must be approved by the department. The following items must be included in your written Plan of Correction:

- 1. Identification of issue(s) of concern;
- 2. Provisions for how you will correct and maintain compliance;
- 3. Specify the written documentation to be provided to the Department;
- 4. Identify who is responsible (include position titles) for corrections and maintenance of compliance; and
- 5. Timelines.

Please submit your written Plan of Correction to Lori Pflanz, Child Care Inspection Specialist, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Children's Services Licensing, 301 Centennial Mall South, PO Box 94986, Lincoln NE 68509-4986 within ten calendar days after you receive this letter.

If you do not submit a written Plan of Correction, or the written Plan of Correction is not approved, the department may discipline your license by imposing one or a combination of the following types of Disciplinary Action:

- 1. Issue a probationary (disciplinary) license;
- 2. Suspend or revoke a provisional, probationary, or operating license;
- 3. Impose a civil penalty of up to five dollars per child, based upon the number of children for which the program is authorized to provide child care on the effective date of the finding of violation, for each day the program is in violation;
- 4. Establish restrictions on new enrollment in the program;
- 5. Establish restrictions or other limitations on the number of children or the age of the children served in the program; or
- 6. Establish other restrictions or limitations on the type of service provided by the program.
