## Swanson Before and After School Care Program DHHS Corrective Action Plan

Issue of concern:

On March 9th, 2017, a school-age child was left for a minimum of 3 minutes unsupervised on the outside playground, with no knowledge by any staff that the child was unaccounted for.

Violated Regulations:

391 NAC 4-006.01 Licensee Requirements:

Ensure the center is administered and managed appropriately.

Maintain compliance with all applicable state statutes and school-age regulations.

391 NAC 4-006.02 Director Requirements:

Be responsible for the center's compliance with rules and regulations.

391 NAC 4-006.14B Staffing Requirements:

Each room where children are receiving care must have a teacher who is involved in the direct care of children.

391 NAC 4-006.18 Supervision of Children:

Adequate and appropriate supervision must be provided to children at all times children are in attendance, including during outdoor play. Ultimate responsibility for supervision rests with the licensee.

Provisions for how we will correct and maintain compliance:

- Rachel Storer (Site Director of Swanson Club 66) will receive the Nebraska's Department of Education's training on "Supervision of Children" on Friday, April 28th, 2017. (This is the soonest I could provide Rachel with this training because NDE must have 30 days to process the training request.)
- Rachel Storer (Site Director of Swanson Club 66) will complete the Child Care Management training on April 19th, 2017.
- Julie Oelke (Program Director for Westside Early Childhood Centers) will provide documentation of the completed Child Care Management training to Dawn Kozak.
- Julie Oelke (Program Director for Westside Early Childhood Centers) has created additional coaching sessions for Rachel Storer (Site Director of Swanson Club 66). The coaching sessions will consist of 4 modules and will meet every two weeks with Rachel Storer (Site Director of Swanson Club 66) to discuss the topic, set goals, and reflect on her weekly progress. The 4 modules will be based on the following topics:
  - o Supervision week of April 3rd
  - o DHHS regulations week of April 17th
  - o Staff Management week of May 1st
  - o Leadership week of May 15th

 Julie Oelke (Program Director for Westside Early Childhood Centers) will provide Dawn Kozak documentation of these coaching sessions after each session.

 The following procedures for transitioning children outside once the whole group has gone to the playground was implemented on March 13th, 2017:

 Students will be lined up and documented on a transition sheet for going outside. Once all students are marked down, and the teachers are handed walky-talkies, the teachers will recount all student. After recounting all students a second time, teachers will walk students up to the restroom. Once bathroom breaks are finished, teachers will recount students again. Then, teachers will walk all students outside through the North doorway by the 6th grade classrooms. If a child needs to come back inside for any reason while outside (to go to the restroom, or parent pick up), a staff member will accompany them at ALL times. Students coming down from homework club or art club on Tuesday's or Thursday's will report to the stage. At this time if a student wants to join the rest of the group outside, the teacher will add the student to the transition sheet, walky-talky to confirm the group is still on the playground and then walk the child all the way to the playground. Teachers who are outside on the playground will communicate with the teachers who are inside when they are leaving the playground via walk-talkies.

 Quality assurance checks will be made randomly 4 times during the next 2 months by Julie Oelke (Program Director for Westside Early Childhood Centers) to ensure the above procedure is being followed.

 Julie Oelke (Program Director for Westside Early Childhood Centers)
 will provide Dawn Kozak documentation of the quality assurance checks.

#### Dear Rachel Storer / Julie Oelke:

Nebraska Revised Statutes, section 71-1911 (4), of the Child Care Licensing Act, provides that the deptarment may place a license on Corrective Action Status... A non-disciplinary probationary license may be issued for the licensee to operate under Corrective Action Status if the department determines that:

- a) The Licensee is unable to comply with all licensure requiremnts and standards or has had a history of noncompliance;
- b) The effect of non compliance with any rule or regulation does not present an unreasonable risk to the health, safety or well-being of children or staff; and

  The Licensee has a written plan of correction that has been approved by the department.

#### **FACTS:**

On 3-09-17, a school-age child was left for a minimum of 3 minutes unsupervised on the outside playground, with no knowledge by any staff that the child was unaccounted for.

#### **REGULATORY BASES:**

#### 391 NAC 4-006.01 Licnesee Requirements:

Ensure the center is administered and managed appropriately.

Maintain compliance with all applicable state statutes and school-age only regulations.

#### 391 NAC 4-006.02 Director Requirements

Be responsible for the center's compliance with rules and regulations.

#### 391 NAC 4-006.14B Staffing Requirements

Each room where children are receving care must have a teacher who is involved in the direct care of children

#### 391 NAC 4-006.18 Supervision of Children

Adequate and appropriate supervision must be provided to children at all times children are in attendance, including during outdoor play. Ultimate responsibility for supervision rests with the licensee.

Based on the facts presented above and the regulations violated, the department is placing your operating license on Corrective Action Status for a period of six (6) months.

Corrective action status is voluntary and the decision regarding the placement on corrective action status is not appealable. However, you are <u>required</u> to submit a written Plan of Correction that <u>must be</u> <u>approved</u> by the department. The following items must be included in yoru written Plan of Correction:

1) Identification of issue(s) of concern

2) Provisions for how you will correct and maintain compliance;

Specify the written documentation to be provided to the Department.

- 4) Identify who is responsible (include position titles) for corrections and maintenance of compliance; and
- 5) Timelines

Please submit your written Plan of Correction to Dawn Kozak Child Care Inspection Specialist, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Children's Services Licensing, 1313 Farnam Street, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Omaha, NE 68102 within ten calendar days after you receive this letter.

If you do not submit a written Plan of Correction, or the written Plan of Correction is not approved, the department may discipline your license by imposing one or a combination of the following types of Disciplinary Action:

1. Issue a probationary (disciplinary) license;

Suspend or revoke a provisional, probationary, or operating license;

Impose a civil penalty of up to five dollars per child, based upon the number of children for
which the program is authorized to provide child care effective date of finding violation, for each day the
program is in violation;

Establish restrictions on new enrollment of the program;

5. Establish restrictions or other limitations on the number of children, or the age of the children served in this program; or

Establish other restrictions or limitations on the type of service provided by the program.
