Chapter 3 - Boating Regulations

017 Boating Safety Education

Under authority of and in compliance with sections 37-1241.01 through 37-1241.08, the following regulations are prescribed by the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission and are effective following enactment by the Game and Parks Commission, approval by the Attorney General and Governor, and when five days have elapsed since filing with the Secretary of State.

The following regulations are prescribed by the Game and Parks Commission, State of Nebraska in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 37-1241.01 through 37-1241.08. For purposes of these regulations, unless context otherwise requires, the definitions found in Chapter 37, sections 202 through 247 of the Game Law, are used. These regulations are effective following enactment by the Commission, approval by the Attorney General and Governor, and when five days have elapsed since filing with the Secretary of State.

<u>017.01</u> It shall be unlawful to fail to immediately show upon demand to any officer or person whose duty it is to enforce the State Boat Act satisfactory proof of completion of a boating safety course as provided in Nebraska State Statute 37-1241.06.

<u>017.02</u> No person shall permit or knowingly authorize the operation of any motorboat contrary to Nebraska State Statute 37-1241.06.

017.03 The Commission shall administer the boater education program.

017.03A Boater Education certificates of successful completion shall be issued by the Commission to persons who have completed an accredited training program approved by the Commission.

<u>017.03 The Nebraska Boating Basics boating safety course shall consist of a minimum of six formal classroom hours and shall be taught by instructors approved by the Commission.</u>

017.03A Satisfactory completion of the boating safety course is 75% accurateness of a proctored exam approved by the Commission.

<u>017.04</u> The Nebraska Boating Basics Home-study boating safety course shall consist of a minimum of two formal classroom hours and shall be taught by instructors approved by the commission. 017.04A Satisfactory completion of the home-study boating safety course is 75% accurateness of a proctored exam approved by the Commission.

<u>017.05</u> Reciprocity - Successful completion of boating safety courses certified and recognized by other States will be accepted in lieu of Nebraska Boating Basics by a nonresident motorboat, including personal watercraft operator. It shall be the responsibility of the non-resident motorboat, including personal watercraft operator to provide proof of such successful completion of a boating safety course certified and recognized by any other State if such person is operating any motorboat, including personal watercraft operator to provide proof of the waters of this state.

017.04 Reciprocity – As proof of successful completion for required boater education training, the Commission may accept any certificate of successful completion issued by the person's state, province, or country of residence that meets or exceeds standards established by the National Association of Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA). Successful completion of boating safety courses certified by other states will be accepted in lieu of Nebraska Boating Basics by a non-resident motorboat, including personal watercraft operator. It shall be the responsibility of the non-resident motorboat, including personal watercraft operator to provide proof of such successful completion of a boating safety course certified by any other state if such person is operating any motorboat, including personal watercraft operator.
