EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission is amending the above-referenced regulations as provided by law, and hereby submits this explanatory statement to accompany the regulation and describe their purposes and the changes made during the rule-making process.

I. Summary: Changes made to existing regulations.

II. Overview of Purposes and Changes Made

Section <u>037</u>. Last Date Approved changed. Sub-part <u>037.01A1</u> deletes the Pine Ridge North Sub-unit boundary descriptions. Sub-part <u>037.01A2</u> deletes the Pine Ridge South Sub-unit boundary descriptions.

Part <u>037.02A</u> deletes the Pine Ridge "North Sub-unit" from the title, changes the regulations citation and changes the open season dates for the Pine Ridge Unit. Part <u>037.02B</u> deletes the Pine Ridge South Sub-unit and deletes the open season dates. Part <u>037.02C</u> is renumbered to Part <u>037.02B</u>, deletes "North Sub-unit" from the title, changes the regulation citation and changes the open season dates for the Pine Ridge Auxiliary Season. Part <u>037.02D</u> deletes the Pine Ridge "South Sub-unit" and deletes the open season dates for the Auxiliary Season.

Part <u>037.03A</u> deletes the "North Sub-unit" from the Pine Ridge title and changes the regulations citation. Part <u>037.03B</u> deletes the "South Sub-unit" and deletes the annual harvest limit. Part <u>037.04A</u> deletes the "North Sub-unit" from the title and changes the regulation citation. Part <u>037.04B</u> deletes the Pine Ridge South Sub-unit and deletes the Pine Ridge South Sub-unit permits allowed to be issued for that unit. Part <u>037.04C</u> is renumbered to Part <u>037.04B</u>, deletes the reference to "North Sub-unit" Auxiliary Season, and changes the regulation citations. Part <u>037.04D</u> deletes the Pine Ridge South Sub-unit Auxiliary Season.

Part <u>037.07A</u> changes the Application Period for mountain lions from the Tuesday following Labor Day through September 27 to the first Monday in November through the second Wednesday in December.

Part <u>037.08</u> changes the checking requirements for mountain lions that the unfrozen lion must be presented to a Commission representative within 24 hours and that the mountain lion must be checked in the Pine Ridge Management Unit.

Sub-part <u>037.10C</u> changes the regulation citation. Sub-part <u>037.10F</u> is new language that provides that it is unlawful to separate a mountain lion carcass into portions smaller

than the head and quarters with proof of gender, naturally attached, before successfully completing the check station process; it also clarifies that "quarters" shall mean four legs with femur or scapula naturally attached and loins. Sub-part <u>037.14F</u> (old) is renumbered to Sub-part 037.10G.

The regulations allow residents an opportunity to hunt mountain lions in the Pine Ridge Management Unit in the state of Nebraska with open seasons, annual harvest limits, an updated application period, updated checking requirements, clarified regulation on the check station process and potential use of auxiliary seasons. Due to the reduction in harvest limit, there will be a reduction in permits available and the sub-units have been combined into one unit.

The proposed regulation is consistent with the legislative intent established by Section 84-907.09. The proposed regulation is not the result of any state or federal mandate, rendering a state or federal funding mechanism not applicable. The Commission will solicit public comment prior to the date of the public hearing. The Commission did not use the Negotiated Rule-Making Act in developing the proposed regulation.

Chapter 4 - Wildlife Regulations

037 Mountain Lions

The following regulations are prescribed by the Game and Parks Commission, State of Nebraska in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 37-301, 37-304, 37-308, 37-308.01, 37-314, 37-228, 37-404, 37-405, 37-411, 37-426, 37-452, 37-473, 37-613. For purposes of these regulations, unless context otherwise requires, the definitions found in Chapter 37, sections 202 through 247 of the Game Law, are used.

<u>037.01</u> Management Unit Boundaries: Federal and state sanctuaries and refuges are closed, unless otherwise authorized.

037.01A Pine Ridge

Those parts of Box Butte, Dawes, Sheridan, and Sioux counties north of the Niobrara River and west of NE Hwy. 27.

037.01A1 Pine Ridge North Sub-unit

Those parts of Dawes, Sheridan, and Sioux counties north of NE Hwy. 20 and west of NE Hwy. 27.

037.01A2 Pine Ridge South Sub-unit

Those parts of Box Butte, Dawes, Sheridan, and Sioux counties north of the Niobrara River, south of NE Hwy. 20, and west of NE Hwy. 27.

037.02 Open Seasons:

037.02A Pine Ridge North Sub-unit (037.01A4)

Season 1: January 2 through February 29 28, 2020 2021, except the season shall immediately close if either the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03A) is reached.

037.02B Pine Ridge South Sub-unit (037.01A2):

<u>Season 1</u>: January 2 through February 29, 2020, except the season shall immediately close if either the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03B) is reached.

037.02C 037.02B Pine Ridge North Sub-unit (037.01A1)

Auxiliary Season: The auxiliary season will open March 45 13 through March 31, 2020 2021, if the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03A) was not reached during Season 1 (037.02A), except the season shall immediately close if either the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03A) is reached prior to March 31.

037.02D Pine Ridge South Sub-unit (037.01A2)

Auxiliary Season: The auxiliary season will open March 15 through March 31, 2020, if the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03B) was not reached during Season 1 (037.02B), except the season shall immediately close if either the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03B) is reached prior to March 31.

037.03 Annual Harvest Limits:

037.03A Pine Ridge North Sub-unit (037.01A4):

Four (4) mountain lions, with a sub-limit of two (2) females.

037.03B Pine Ridge South Sub-unit (037.01A2):

Four (4) mountain lions, with a sub-limit of two (2) females.

037.04 Permits:

037.04A Pine Ridge North Sub-unit (037.01A4):

Season 1: The Commission shall issue three hundred and twenty (320) permits by lottery. No person shall be issued more than one (1) permit per calendar year. Permits shall be issued to Nebraska residents only.

037.04B Pine Ridge South Sub-unit (037.01A2):

Season 1: The Commission shall issue three hundred twenty (320) permits by lottery. No person shall be issued more than one (1) permit per calendar year. Permits shall be issued to Nebraska residents only.

037.04C 037.04B Pine Ridge North Sub-unit Auxiliary Season:

If the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (037.03A) have not been met by the end of the Pine Ridge North Sub-unit (037.01A4) Season 1 (037.02A), unsuccessful permittees may apply to convert their permit to a Pine Ridge North Auxiliary Season (037.02C 037.02B) permit. A number of auxiliary permits equal to the number of animals remaining in the harvest limit for the sub-unit will be issued by lottery.

037.04D Pine Ridge South Sub-unit Auxiliary Season:

If the annual harvest limit or female sub-limit (<u>037.03B</u>) have not been met by the end of the Pine Ridge North Sub-unit (<u>037.01A2</u>) Season 1 (<u>037.02B</u>), unsuccessful permittees may apply to convert their permit to a Pine Ridge South Auxiliary Season (<u>037.02D</u>) permit. A number of auxiliary permits equal to the number of animals remaining in the harvest limit for the sub-unit will be issued by lottery.

037.05 Permit Bag Limit: One (1) mountain lion of either sex.

037.06 Shooting Hours: Sunrise to sunset.

037.07 Application Periods:

<u>037.07A</u> Pine Ridge: Applications for lottery permits shall be accepted from 1:00 p.m. CST on the Tuesday following Labor Day through September 27 first Monday in November through the second Wednesday in December prior to each open season. Mail applications must be received in the Commission's Lincoln headquarters office by 5 p.m. CST, and internet applications must be received by 11:59 p.m. CST. All valid applications accompanied by the required fee (Administration Regulations, Chapter 1, Section <u>006</u>) shall be considered equally in a random drawing. It shall be unlawful to submit more than one application per calendar year for a mountain lion permit. If more than one such application is submitted by or for any person, all of that person's applications shall be excluded from the drawing and the accompanying fees shall be forfeited.

<u>037.08</u> Checking: Any mountain lion harvested must be reported to the Commission within eight (8) hours of recovering the animal using a phone number or website specified by the Commission or in person at a district office during normal business hours. The <u>entire</u> unfrozen <u>carcass mountain lion</u>, <u>with proof of gender naturally attached</u>, must be presented to a Commission representative within 24 hours of the time it is killed to allow for inspection and attachment of an official harvest seal. Once notified of harvest, the Commission may make arrangements for a later check. The permittee shall furnish the Commission with the date and location of kill prior to the attachment of the harvest seal. The harvest seal must remain attached to the mountain lion until the pelt is tanned, mounted or otherwise preserved. The Commission may collect a tissue sample from each mountain lion harvested. Mountain lions must be checked in the Pine Ridge Management Unit (037.01A).

037.09 Weapons Allowed: Firearms and archery equipment as specified in <u>001.01B2</u>.

037.10 It shall be unlawful to:

<u>037.10A</u> harvest or attempt to harvest a mountain lion with a spotted coat (kitten) or any mountain lion accompanying another mountain lion.

<u>037.10B</u> hunt mountain lions without first confirming that the harvest limit or female sub-limit has not been met, and the season is open each day by checking the Commission-provided toll-free number or season status website.

<u>037.10C</u> hunt mountain lions with the aid of dogs, traps or bait, with the exception that dogs may be used during an auxiliary season (<u>037.02C</u>, <u>037.02D</u>), if an auxiliary season is held.

037.10D fail to check or report any mountain lion taken as prescribed in 037.08.

037.10E falsely check or report the harvest of any mountain lion.

037.10F to separate a mountain lion carcass into portions smaller than the head, and quarters with proof of gender naturally attached, before successfully completing the check station process (037.08). Quarters shall mean four (4) legs with femur or scapula naturally attached and loins.

037.10F 037.10G obtain more than one mountain lion permit per calendar year.
