#### **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission is amending the above-referenced regulations as provided by law, and hereby submits this explanatory statement to accompany the regulation and describe their purposes and the changes made during the rule-making process.

- I. Summary: Changes made to existing regulations.
- II. Overview of Purposes and Changes Made

**Section <u>002</u>**. Last approved date changed. Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 37-314 provides authority to the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission to create Commission Orders that do not process through the regulation stages of Attorney General, Governor's Policy Research Office and Secretary of State. These regulations will still contain permit eligibility, application period and procedure; legal weapons; and hunter orange requirements for turkey hunting.

The statutory citation 37-452 is being removed from the citations paragraph since turkeys are not reference in that statute.

After the statutory citation paragraph, guidance is provided that season dates, permit bag limits, number of permits authorized, shooting hours and open areas is contained within the new Commission Order <u>C02</u>, Wild Turkey, on the Commission's website and the website address is provided.

Sub-section <u>002.01</u> adds "Methods of Take, Youth Eligibility" to clarify the contents of the sub-section and deletes "and Season Dates" from the title as it is moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>. Sub-part <u>002.01A2</u> regarding Spring season dates is deleted and moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>. Division <u>002.01A2a</u> regarding the spring shotgun season dates is deleted and moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>. Division <u>002.01A2b</u> regarding the spring archery season dates is deleted and moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>. Division <u>002.01A3a</u> regarding the youth shotgun season dates is deleted and moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>, "persons with these permits may hunt with weapons legally" is deleted and reworded for continuity and a second reference to "and with weapons prescribed for shotgun hunting seasons (<u>001.01B2</u>)" was deleted due to redundancy. Sup-part <u>002.01B2</u> regarding the title for fall season dates for archery and shotgun is deleted and moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>. Division <u>002.01B2a</u> regarding the fall season dates is deleted and moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u>. Division <u>002.01B3a</u>

regarding the fall youth season dates is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02. Sub-Section 002.02 regarding the number of permits authorized and personal limits apply is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02, and additional permits authorized in combination permits is being deleted since it is already in regulations in a different location. Sub-Section 002.03 regarding the area open and exceptions is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02. Sub-Section 002.04 regarding the title Permit Bag Limit is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02. Part 002.04A regarding the spring bag limit of one male or bearded female turkey is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02. Part 002.04B regarding the Fall bag limit as two (2) turkeys is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02. Sub-Section 002.05 regarding the shooting hours is deleted and moved to Commission Order C02,

Sub-part <u>002.01A3</u> is renumbered to Sub-part <u>002.01A2</u>, and within that paragraph, the regulation citations are changed to reflect the information being moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u> and provides the Commission Order citations. Sup-part <u>002.01A4</u> is renumbered to Sup-part <u>002.01A3</u>. In Division <u>002.01A3a</u> the regulation citations are changed to reflect the information being moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u> and provides the Commission Order citations. Division <u>002.01A4b</u> is renumbered to Division <u>002.01A3b</u>, and within that paragraph, the regulation citations are changed to reflect the information being moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u> and provides the Commission Order citation. Sub-part <u>002.01B3</u> was renumbered to Sub-part <u>002.01B2</u>. In Division <u>002.01B3b</u> the regulation citations are changed to reflect the information being moved to Commission Order <u>C02</u> and provides the Commission Order citations. Sub-section <u>002.06</u> has been renumbered to Sub-section <u>002.02</u>. Section <u>002</u> ends on page 4-002-2.

The enactment of these regulation changes reflects the creation of a Commission Order to more effectively manage the wild turkey program. Open seasons, number of permits authorized, permit bag limit, shooting hours, areas open wild turkey hunting are deleted from regulations and included in the newly created Commission Order CO2. Regulations will contain guidance where season dates, permits authorized, permit bag limit, shooting hours, and open areas may be found in Commission Order CO2 on the Nebraska Game and Parks website.

These regulations will contain permit eligibility, application period and procedure; legal weapons; and requirements to wear hunter orange for turkey hunting.

The proposed regulation is consistent with the legislative intent established by Section 84-907.09. The proposed regulation is not the result of any state or federal mandate, rendering a state or federal funding mechanism not applicable. The Commission will solicit public comment prior to the date of the public hearing. The Commission did not use the Negotiated Rule-Making Act in developing the proposed regulation.

002 Wild Turkey

The following regulations are prescribed by the Game and Parks Commission, State of Nebraska in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 37-314, 37-404, 37-414, 37-447, 37-452, 37-457, 37-502, 37-508, 37-527, 37-534, 37-701. For purposes of these regulations, unless context otherwise requires, the definitions found in Chapter 37, sections 202 through 247 of the Game Law, are used. These regulations are effective following enactment by the Commission, approval by the Attorney General and Governor, and when five days have elapsed since filing with the Secretary of State.

For season dates, bag limits, permits authorized, shooting and hunting areas, see Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Order C02 on the Commission's website: outdoornebraska.gov.

002.01 Application Periods, Methods of Take, Youth Eligibility and Season Dates

002.01A Spring

<u>002.01A1</u> Permit Application Periods: The second Monday in January at 1 p.m. CST until the end of the season.

002.01A2 Season Dates

002.01A2a Shotgun Season Dates: The Saturday closest to April 15 to May 31.

002.01A2b Archery Season Dates: March 25 through May 31.

<u>002.01A3</u> <u>002.01A2</u> Persons with this permit may hunt with weapons legally prescribed for archery turkey hunting (<u>001.01B3</u>) during the dates shown in <u>002.01A2b</u> (Commission Orders) <u>C02.01A</u> and with weapons legally prescribed for shotgun turkey hunting (<u>001.01B2</u>) during the dates shown in <u>002.01A2a</u> (Commission Orders) <u>C02.01C</u>.

Title 163 Chapter 4

<u>002.02</u> Number of Permits Authorized for Issuance: Unlimited. Personal limits apply, see <u>001.01B1</u>. Permits may be authorized to be included in species combination permits (003.12).

<u>002.03</u> Area Open: Entire state except Federal or State sanctuaries and refuges, unless otherwise authorized.

002.04 Permit Bag Limit:

002.04A Spring: One male or bearded female turkey.

002.04B Fall: Two (2) turkeys.

002.05 Shooting Hours: 30 minutes before sunrise to sunset.

<u>002.06</u> <u>002.02</u> Hunter Orange: Shall not be required during spring turkey season. Hunter orange shall not be required during fall turkey season, except that it shall be required during the November firearm deer season.
