#### NEBRASKA NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION NOTICE OF RULEMAKING HEARINGS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Nebraska Natural Resources Commission ("Commission"), will hold public rulemaking hearings pursuant to *Neb. Rev. Stat.* §§ 2-1503.02; 2-1578; 2-15,123, 46-1404; 84-907. The hearings will be held hourly beginning at 9:00 a.m. on November 3, 2020, in the main conference room at the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources ("Department") offices located on the 4<sup>th</sup> Floor of the Nebraska State Office Building, 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, Nebraska, 68509.

The purpose of the hearings is to take public comments concerning the adoption of the Commission's proposed amendments to the following rules in the *Neb. Admin. Code*: Title 257 "Administration of Small Watersheds Flood Control Fund"; Title 259 "Administration of the Water Well Decommissioning Fund"; Title 260 "Natural Resources Commission Rules of Practice and Procedure"; Title 262 "Administration of the Nebraska Soil and Water Conservation Fund"; and Title 263 "Administration of the Natural Resources Water Quality Fund."

All proposed amendments to each of the foregoing Titles include removing the title page and table of contents, as well as removing and altering language to alter the style or form of the rule, and updating statutory references that do not alter the substance of the rule. Neb. Rev. Stat. § 84-907(3).

A description of the proposed amendments specific to each Title and their hearing times are as follows:

9:00 a.m. - Title 257: This title is consolidated into one chapter—Chapter 2 is moved into Section 002 of Chapter 1 and renumbered; deletes language that is duplicative of statute and references back to the relevant statute when applicable; changes the date to provide a notice of intent to acquire or retain land to the deadline in the Department's notice; increases an agreement term from 25 to 50 years.

10:00 a.m. - Title 259: This title is consolidated into one Chapter—Chapters 2, 3, and 4 are moved into Sections 002, 003, and 004 of Chapter 1, respectively, and renumbered; deletes language that is duplicative of statute and references back to the relevant statute when applicable; deletes language from revising allocations and expiration of allocations rules that does not alter the substance of the rule.

11:00 a.m. - Title 260: This title is consolidated into one Chapter; deletes Chapter 1 General Definitions; consolidates Chapters 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 into various sections of the new Chapter 1; deletes Chapters 6 and 7 and associated Appendix "A" and adopts the Model Rules of Agency Procedure by the Nebraska Attorney General: Petitioning for Rulemaking and Regulations and Procedures Governing Agency Declaratory Orders.

1:00 p.m. - Title 262: deletes language that is duplicative of statute and references back to the relevant statute when applicable; deleted provisions related to the Department's administration of the fund.

2:00 p.m. - Title 263: This title is consolidated into one Chapter—Chapters 2 and 3 are moved into Sections 002 and 003 of Chapter 1, respectively, and renumbered.

The rules as amended are available at the offices of the Secretary of State, Regulations/Licensing Division, Room 1305, State Capitol, Lincoln, Nebraska 68509, and on the Commission's website at <a href="https://nrc.nebraska.gov/statutes-and-rules">https://nrc.nebraska.gov/statutes-and-rules</a>. There will be no fiscal impact from the changes.

<u>Chapter-CHAPTER 1 — ADMINISTRATION OF NATURAL RESOURCES WATER QUALITY FUNDGENERAL PROVISIONS</u>

#### 001 General Provisions.

<u>001.01</u> Purpose of Rules. -These rules are adopted for the purpose of administering the Natural Resources Water Quality Fund (<u>Fund</u>) governed by <u>Neb. Rev. Stat. §§Sections</u> 2-15,122 and 2-15,123, <u>as amended by Sections 1 and 2, LB 329, 97<sup>th</sup> Nebraska Legislature</u>, 1<sup>st</sup> <u>Session (2001)</u>.

<u>001.02002</u> General Availability of Funds. -Financial assistance from the Fund <u>wishall</u> be available only to <u>NRDnatural resources districts DDistricts which that</u> have programs qualifying for such assistance under these rules and which have entered into a <u>contractual arrangement contract</u> with the Department setting forth the terms for providing such financial assistance.

<u>001.03003</u> <u>Definitions.</u> -As used in these rules<del>- and regulations</del>, unless the context otherwise requires:

<u>003.01</u> "Commission" shall means the Natural Resources Commission created pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §Section 2-1504, R.S. Supp., 2000, and amendments thereto;

\_\_\_\_\_\_\_0013.03(A)2 "Commission," "Department," and "Director," and "District" have the same meaning as in Title 259 shall means the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources created by Neb. Rev. Stat. §Section 81-101, R.S. Supp., 2000, and amendments thereto; and

#### Title 263 Chapter 1

<u>003.03</u> "Director" shall means the individual holding the position of Director of Natural Resources created by Neb. Rev. Stat. §Section 81-102, R.S. Supp., 2000f "NRD" shall means a district created and operating in accordance with Chapter 2, Article 32, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; and

<u>0013.03(B)25</u> "Fund" shall means the Natural Resources Water Quality Fund created by Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 2-15,122, as amended by Section 1, LB 329, 97<sup>th</sup> Nebraska Legislature, 1<sup>st</sup> Session (2001).

001.04004 Access to Files and Compliance with Agreement and Rules and Regulations. Each participating Ddistrictnatural resources district must shall maintain records adequate to document that the DdDdistrict had expenditures qualified pursuant to Chapter Section 003 of these rules in amounts equal to or exceeding the amount provided from the Fund plus the required cost-share. -Such files are to shall be available for inspection by personnel of the Department personnel and by representatives of the State Auditor's Ooffice during normal business hours of the DdDdistrict. -In the event that the Director becomes aware of a violation of the contract between the DdDdistrict and the Department or of these rules and regulations, the Director may terminate the contract and/or demand reimbursement of any State funds related to such violation.

#### 002 Distribution of Funds. Chapter 2 DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS

<u>002.014</u> Schedule for Distributing Funds. -Funds <u>willshall</u> be distributed, pursuant to Subsection 002.02 of this chapter to pparticipating <u>Ddd</u>istricts on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August, each year and at such other times during the year as the Director determines that sufficient additional funds are available to make a distribution and the pparticipating <u>Ddd</u>istricts indicate their ability to use additional funds.

<u>002.02</u> <u>Determining Distributions</u>. -The money available for each distribution from the Fund <u>shallwill</u> be divided among <u>pp</u>articipating <u>Ddd</u>istricts as follows:

<u>002.02(A)</u> Except as provided by <u>Subsection 002.044 of this Chapter</u>, <u>sixty 60</u> percent of the funds available <u>willshall</u> be distributed to <u>Ddd</u>istricts on the basis of proportionate fertilizer sales within the <u>Ddd</u>istricts during the preceding three calendar years for which sales records by county are available from Nebraska Agricultural Statistics or a comparable source. -For a county <u>which that</u> is contained within more than one <u>Ddd</u>istrict, each <u>Ddd</u>istrict's proportion of sales <u>willshall</u> be based upon its proportionate land area within the county. -If sales records are not made available for any county, the <u>Director willshall</u> establish that county's portion of the statewide sales total. -That decision <u>willshall</u> be based upon the best available information, which may include, but not be limited to, county land area and sales in adjacent counties. In the event the Commission chooses to reserve up to <u>ten-10</u> percent of funds available for special distribution pursuant to <u>Subsection 002.0044 of this Chapter</u>, the amount of funds available for distribution pursuant to this <u>S</u>subsection <u>willshall</u> be decreased by the amount reserved.

<u>002.02(B)</u>- Twenty <u>20</u> percent of the funds available <u>willshall</u> be divided equally among all participating <u>Ddistricts</u>.

#### Title 263 Chapter 2

<u>002.02(C)3</u> Twenty <u>20</u> percent of the funds <u>willshall</u> be distributed among <u>D</u>districts which have (1) a designated ground water management area for water quality purposes or (2) a clean lakes watershed area designated pursuant to Section 314 of the Clean Water Act, or comparable federally-funded program. Each <u>D</u>district's distribution pursuant to this <u>S</u>subsection <u>willshall</u> be based upon the proportionate land area in that <u>D</u>district which is in such a designated area compared to the total land area within the <u>S</u>state in such designated areas. -If specific lands are in more than one such designated area, they <u>willshall</u> be counted only once for purposes of this <u>S</u>subsection.

<u>002.03</u> At least <u>thirty 30</u> days prior to a distribution pursuant to <u>Subsection 002.02 of this chapter</u>, the Department <u>willshall</u> notify each <u>Ddd</u>istrict of the estimated amount of funds to be distributed to that <u>Ddd</u>istrict. -If any <u>Ddd</u>istrict does not believe it could fully utilize any such distribution in the amount estimated, it <u>mustshall</u> provide the Department with timely notification of the amount of funds <u>which that</u> it could utilize for qualified programs. -The difference between that amount and the amount that would otherwise be distributed to that <u>Ddd</u>istrict pursuant to <u>Subsection 002.02 of this Chapter</u> will be divided among the other <u>pparticipating <u>Ddd</u>istricts according to <u>Ssubsections 002.02(A)+</u> through 002.02(C)3.</u>

<u>002.044</u> The Commission may reserve up to <u>ten-10</u> percent of the funds that otherwise would be distributed pursuant to <u>Subsection 002.02</u> of this Chapter as part of the first distribution in any fiscal year. -Any such reserved funds will be distributed by the Director to <u>participating Ddd</u>istricts for specific programs and/or projects by September 15 of the fiscal year in which they are to be expended.- <u>Application for such funds mustshall be made on a form provided by the Department.</u> If the available funds are not sufficient to fund all those for which application has been made, priority will be given to programs and projects offering innovative ways to address water quality problems. -No <u>Ddd</u>istrict <u>mayshall</u> receive more than <u>twenty-five25</u> percent of the funds distributed pursuant to this <u>Subsection</u> in any one fiscal year unless funds are available for all other qualified applications submitted.

#### <u>Chapter 3 QUALIFYING EXPENDITURES</u>003 Qualifying Expenditures.

003.014 Qualifying Programs and Projects. Subject to the requirement of Subsection 003.022 of this Chapter, a participating Delistrict may expend funds distributed pursuant to Chapter Section 002 of these rules for costs incurred by that Delistrict for any of the following programs and projects: (1) the purchase, installation, maintenance, and use of ground water or surface water sampling and testing equipment; (2) the purchase, installation, maintenance, and use of surface water sampling and testing equipment; (23) education and information programs related to water quality issues; (34) administration of ground water quality management areas; (45) purchase, installation, and maintenance of special monitoring wells and related equipment; (56) flow meters and other equipment required in ground water management areas; (67) source water protection programs and activities; (78) preparation and updating of ground water management plans; (89) implementation of water quality "best management" practices in both rural and urban areas, including programs which that cost-share expenses of landowners and operators in installing or using such practices; (910) soil sampling and testing programs for soils in and below the crop root zone; (104) water quality research; (112) well decommissionings; (123) c—chemigation permitting and inspection programs; (134) investigations, because of water quality concerns, of potential replacement sources of water for public water suppliers; (145) animal waste management activities including research, treatment lagoon cost-sharing, feedlot waste effluent management, and inactive feedlot management; and (156) other water quality related programs and projects approved in advance by the Director. The Director hasshall have sole discretion to determine whether a Delistrict's program qualifies for funding pursuant to this Ssubsection.

<u>003.022</u> Cost-Share Requirement. For each two dollars expended by the <u>D</u>district from the funds distributed pursuant to <u>Chapter-Section 00</u>2 of these rules, the <u>D</u>district <u>mustshall</u> spend at least three dollars in funds derived from other non-state sources for the programs and projects identified in S<u>ubs</u>ection 00<u>3.011 of this chapter</u>.

## Title 263 Chapter 3

003.03 Certification of Expenditures and Reimbursement of Funds. -Funds distributed pursuant to Chapter Section 002 of these rules and regulations must be expended by the Dedistrict in the fiscal year distributed. -On or before August 31, the Dedistrict mustshall account for expenditure of the funds made available from the Fund in the previous fiscal year. The Department willshall provide a form for such purposes. In the event that all funds distributed in the previous fiscal year were not expended by June 30 of that fiscal year, or that any funds were expended for programs or projects that the Director determines were not qualified for funding, or that the Dedistrict did not match the funds distributed in the proportion required by Subsection 003.022 of this hapter, the Dedistrict shall reimburse the Department for the amount thus unexpended, improperly expended, or unmatched. -All such reimbursed funds willshall be redeposited in the Fund for redistribution in accordance with Chapter Section 002 of these rules and regulations. No new distributions mayshall be made to a Dedistrict which that has not made a reimbursement required by this Section.
