Buccal cell samples will be stored at room temperature in a secure location. Blood samples will be stored in the refrigerator until they are spotted on FTA paper. Once the blood samples have been spotted, the FTA paper will be stored at room temperature in a secure location and the liquid blood sample destroyed.

<u>004.01C</u> In the event of a Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) hit, the fingerprint provided with the DNA sample will be verified.

O04.01D If it is necessary to request a re-collection of either a blood or buccal cell sample, this information will be documented. It is not the responsibility of the NSPCL to ensure that recollection is accomplished.

<u>005</u> <u>Sample Analysis by the NSPCL</u>
