The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission is amending the above-referenced regulations as provided by law, and hereby submits this explanatory statement to accompany the regulation and describe their purposes and the changes made during the rulemaking process.

Section <u>003</u>. Last approved date changed.

Sub-part 003-02A1

Period 1: The references to which periods any forfeited permits go to is changed to Periods 7 and 8.

Period 2: change the date that residents and nonresidents may begin purchasing unlimited deer and antelope permits to the Second Monday in July.

Period 3: Create a new Period 3 that establishes the Tuesday following the second Monday in July as the date that residents may begin to purchase any limited deer permits.

Period 4: Create a new Period 4 that establishes the Wednesday following the second Monday in July as the date that residents may begin to purchase any limited antelope permits.

Period 5: Create a Period 5 that establishes the fourth Monday in July as the date that nonresidents may begin to purchase any limited deer permits.

Period 6: Create a Period 6 that establishes the Tuesday following the fourth Monday in July as the date that residents and nonresidents may begin to purchase any limited antelope permits.



Period 7: Create a Period 7 that establishes the first Monday in August as the date that residents and nonresidents may begin to purchase any remaining limited deer permits from any of the previous periods.

Period 8: Create a Period 8 that establishes the Tuesday following the first Monday in August as the date that residents and nonresidents may begin to purchase any remaining limited antelope permits from any of the previous periods.

These changes are being made to allow residents to purchase deer and antelope permits in non-draw units prior to non-residents, giving residents preference over non-residents.

Sub-parts <u>003.02A1</u>, <u>003.02B1</u>, <u>003.02B4</u>, <u>003.04A5</u>, <u>003.04C6</u>, and <u>003.05A1</u> have minor changes to language to correct the reference of central standard time (CST) to the correct term of central daylight time (CDT) and spelling out numbers for consistency throughout the section.

The following regulations are prescribed by the Game and Parks Commission, State of Nebraska in accordance with Neb. Rev. 003.01 Weapons Allowed

<u>003.01A</u> Firearm, muzzleloader, and archery equipment as specified in <u>001.01B2</u> and <u>001.01B3</u> for Antelope Firearm, Deer Firearm, Youth Deer, Landowner Deer, Special Landowner Deer Season, Statewide Whitetail Buck, River Antlerless, Mule Deer Conservation Area, and Elk permits as described in Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Order <u>C03</u>, Sections <u>C03.02</u>, <u>C03.05</u>, <u>C03.08</u>, <u>C03.09</u>, <u>C03.10</u>, <u>C03.11H</u>, and <u>C03.12</u>, respectively. Season-specific weapon restrictions also apply; see Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Order <u>C03</u>, Sections <u>C03.05C</u>, <u>C03.08A</u>, <u>C03.09A</u>, <u>C03.10A</u>, <u>C03.11G1</u>, <u>C03.11H</u>, and <u>C03.12A2</u>.

Mail applications must be received in the Lincoln office of the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission by 5 p.m. CST CDT. Internet applications must be received by 11:59 p.m. CST CDT. Residents and nonresidents may apply for a Preference Point or one deer permit in the following draw units: Platte Mule Deer Conservation Area, and Frenchman Mule Deer Conservation Area. Residents and eligible resident and nonresident landowners may apply for a Preference Point or one antelope permit in the following draw units: Banner North, Banner South, Box Butte East, Box Butte West, Cherry, Cheyenne, Dismal, Eastern Sandhills, Garden, North Sioux, Prairie Muzzleloader and North Sioux Muzzleloader.

For application purposes, Mmuzzleloader Aantelope permits shall be classed as firearm permits, and provisions for application for these permits shall be the same as prescribed in 001.01A. Unsold North Sioux Muzzleloader Landowner permits may be made available as North Sioux Firearm Landowner permits beginning in Period 4 (see below).

Applicants that were not issued a permit for any unit designated as draw units in the previous year will be given preference.

Applicants supplying valid email addresses will be notified when draw is complete. Those not providing valid email addresses will be responsible to monitor their status on-line. Results of the draw will be available on or before the 4st first Friday in July.

Successful applicants will have until the 3rd third Friday in July to complete the purchase of their awarded permits. Permits awarded but unpaid will result in the applicant losing their preference points and forfeiting the permit. Any forfeited permits may be made available to the next unsuccessful applicant(s), then may go to periods 3 7 and 4 8.

Period 2: Beginning the last second Monday in July at 1 p.m. CST CDT. Residents, nonresidents and eligible resident and nonresident landowners may purchase any unlimited deer and antelope permits (described in Commission Order C03) within permit limits described in 001.01B1.

Period 3: Beginning the first Monday Tuesday following the second Monday in August July at 1 p.m. CST CDT. Residents and nonresidents may purchase any limited deer permits (described in Commission Order C03) in any unit subject to availability and within permit limits described in 001.01B1.

Period 4: Beginning the Tuesday Wednesday following the first second Monday in August July at 1 p.m. CST CDT. Residents, nonresidents and eligible resident and nonresident landowners may purchase any limited

antelope permits (described in Commission Order <u>C03</u>) in any unit subject to availability and within permit limits described in <u>001.01B1</u>.

Period 5: Beginning the fourth Monday in July at 1 p.m. CDT. Nonresidents may purchase any limited deer permits (described in Commission Order C03) within permit limits described in 001.01B1.

An applicant shall not be issued an antlerless elk permit more than once every five (5) years.

<u>003.03A</u> Hunter orange shall not be required of archers hunting deer with weapons described for archery hunting (<u>001.01B2</u> and <u>001.01B3</u>) during the River Antlerless Season and the Special Landowner Deer Season (see Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Order <u>C03</u>, Section C03.11G1 and C03.09).

003.03B Youth Antelope Archery Permits

<u>003.03B1</u> Eligibility: Resident and nonresident youth aged 12 through 15. Youth age 16 may hunt on youth antelope permits provided they are age 15 when they apply and provided they are age 15 on August 20 of the calendar year.

<u>003.03B2</u> Hunting seasons and bag limits as specified for Antelope Archery (See Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Order <u>C03</u>, Section <u>C03.03</u>) are in effect.

003.03C Youth Deer Permits

<u>003.03C1</u> Eligibility: Resident and nonresident youth aged 10 through 15. Youth age 16 may hunt on youth deer permits provided they are age 15 when they apply and provided they are age 15 on September 15 of the calendar year.

<u>003.03C2</u> Hunting seasons and bag limits as specified for Youth Deer Season (See Nebraska Game and Parks Commission Order <u>C03</u>, Section <u>C03.08</u>) are in effect.

<u>003.03D</u> Special check-in requirements for deer units designated as "Earn-A-Buck"

Hunters are required to check an antlerless deer taken under the authority of the unit permit before checking a buck on the unit permit in the same calendar year.

<u>003.03D1</u> The definition of a buck is a deer having at least one antler that is six (6) inches or more in length. An antlerless deer is defined as a deer having no antlers or antlers no more than six (6) inches in length.

003.04 Lottery and Auction Permits

Persons selected to receive an auction permit shall be determined by the highest bid. Persons selected to receive a lottery permit shall be determined by random drawing.

003.04A Combination Antelope, Deer, Turkey Permit

The Commission may authorize permit(s) which allow the harvest of one (1) antelope, one (1) deer, and two (2) turkeys (two (2) in the fall season, two (2) in the spring season, or one (1) in each season) taken in any open area during any Commission authorized seasons corresponding for each species with weapons legal for that season. The Combination Permit is valid until filled during hunting seasons beginning in the year of issuance and seasons beginning in the subsequent calendar year. The following provisions apply:

003.04A1 Antelope

One (1) antelope of either sex, in total, may be taken statewide during any open antelope season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Bucks with horns longer than the ears may not be taken during doe/fawn only seasons.

003.04A2 Deer

One (1) deer of either sex, in total, may be taken statewide during any open deer season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only antlerless deer (See Commission Order C03.05D) may be taken during antlerless only seasons.

003.04A3 Turkey

Two (2) turkeys, in total, may be taken statewide during any open turkey seasons provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only toms and bearded hens may be taken in the spring season.

<u>003.04A4</u> Three (3) permits are authorized per calendar year, including one (1) shared-revenue auction permit for residents and non-residents, one (1) Commission lottery permit for residents only, and one (1) Commission lottery permit for non-residents only.

<u>003.04A5</u> For lottery permits, applications shall be accepted from January 2 beginning at 1 p.m. <u>CST CDT</u> through the first Friday in July (receipt date at Game and Parks Commission office in Lincoln) during years when at least one lottery Combination Antelope, Deer, Turkey Permit is authorized under <u>003.04A4</u>. All valid applications accompanied by the required fee (Chapter 1, Section <u>006</u>; Administration Regulations) shall be considered equally in one drawing for each permit authorized. Applicants may submit multiple applications for lottery permits.

003.04B Combination Deer and Turkey Permit

The Commission may authorize permit(s) which allow the harvest of one (1) deer and two (2) turkeys (two (2) in the fall season, two (2) in the spring season, or one (1) in each season) taken in any open area during any Commission authorized seasons corresponding for each species with weapons legal for that season. The Combination Permit is valid until filled during hunting seasons in the year of issuance and seasons beginning in the subsequent calendar year. The following provisions apply:

003.04B1 Deer

One (1) deer of either sex, in total, may be taken statewide during any open deer season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only antlerless deer (See Commission Order C03.05D) may be taken during antlerless only seasons.

003.04B2 Turkey

Two (2) turkeys, in total, may be taken statewide during any open turkey seasons provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only toms and bearded hens may be taken in the spring season.

<u>003.04B3</u> Four (4) permits are authorized per calendar year, including four (4) shared-revenue auction permits for residents or non-residents.

003.04C Combination Antelope, Deer, Elk, Turkey Permit

The Commission may authorize permit(s) which allow the harvest of one (1) antelope, one (1) deer, one elk and two turkeys (two (2) in the fall season, two (2) in the spring season, or one (1) in each season) taken in any open area during any Commission authorized seasons corresponding for each species with weapons legal for that season. The Combination Permit is valid until filled during hunting seasons beginning in the year of issuance and seasons beginning in the subsequent calendar year. The following provisions apply:

003.04C1 Antelope

One (1) antelope of either sex, in total, may be taken statewide during any open antelope season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Bucks with horns longer than the ears may not be taken during doe/fawn only seasons.

003.04C2 Deer

One (1) deer of either sex, in total, may be taken statewide during any open deer season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only antlerless deer (See Commission Order C03.05D) may be taken during antlerless only seasons.

003.04C3 Elk

One (1) elk of either sex, in total, may be taken statewide during any open elk season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only antlerless elk (See Commission Order C03.12D) may be taken during antlerless only seasons.

003.04C4 Turkey

Two (2) turkeys, in total, may be taken statewide during any open turkey seasons provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only toms and bearded hens may be taken in the spring season.

<u>003.04C5</u> Two (2) permits are authorized per calendar year, including, one (1) Commission lottery permit for residents only, and one (1) Commission lottery permit for residents and non-residents.

<u>003.04C6</u> Applications shall be accepted from January 2 beginning at 1 p.m. <u>CST CDT</u> through the first Friday in July (receipt date at Game and Parks Commission office in Lincoln) during years when at least one (1) lottery Combination Antelope, Deer, Elk, Turkey permit is authorized under <u>003.04C5</u>. All valid applications accompanied by the required fee (Chapter 1, Section <u>006</u>; Administration Regulations) shall be considered equally in one drawing for each permit authorized. It is unlawful to submit more than one application per calendar year for the resident-only lottery Combination Antelope, Deer, Elk, Turkey permit. If more than one such application is submitted by or for any person, all of his/her applications shall be excluded from the drawing and accompanying lottery fees shall be forfeited. Applicants may submit multiple applications for the lottery permit authorized for residents and nonresidents.

003.04D Statewide Elk

The Commission may authorize permit(s) which allow the harvest of one (1) bull elk taken in any open area during any Commission authorized bull elk season.

<u>003.04D1</u> Three (3) shared-revenue auction permits are authorized for residents or non-residents, per calendar year.

003.05 Free-earned Landowner Elk Permit Program.

<u>003.05A</u> Following the verification of ten (10) antlerless elk harvests as defined in <u>37-456.01</u>, a qualifying landowner or leaseholder who owns or leases at least 80 acres of farm or ranch land for agricultural purposes or their immediate family shall qualify for an either sex elk permit.

<u>003.05A1</u> On a form provided by the Commission, the qualifying landowner or leaseholder will provide the following information to record antlerless elk harvests: full name of the landowner or leaseholder, mailing address, legal descriptions of the qualifying farm or ranch land owned, legal descriptions and name of the owner of land leased, names of the hunters and seal numbers of all antlerless elk harvested on described land. Forms will be due by close of business on the <u>3rd third</u> Friday in February after the elk season to the NGPC office referenced in <u>003.02B4a</u>. Only harvests that occur during the most recent early and late antlerless season will be allowed on the form. Special depredation season antlerless harvests will be recorded within one month of the close of the season.

<u>003.05A1(a)</u> It shall be unlawful to falsely report antierless harvests.

<u>003.05A2</u> The free-earned permit must be designated to a hunter <u>003.05A</u> on a form provided by the Commission by the last Friday in March. The form should include the following information: Name of the qualifying landowner or leaseholder, name of the designee, relationship to the landowner or leaseholder, legal descriptions of the qualifying farm or ranch land owned or leased, mailing address, date of birth, gender, height, weight, colors of hair and eyes, daytime phone number, and last four digits of social security number.

<u>003.05A2(a)</u> Harvest is limited to one (1) elk of either sex, and is limited to the lands owned or leased by the qualifying landowner during any open elk season provided weapons legal for that season are used. Only antlerless elk (See Commission Order <u>C03.12D</u>) may be taken during antlerless only seasons.

<u>003.05A2(b)</u> The permit must be designated for the next elk season following the tenth (10th) qualifying antlerless harvest.

<u>003.05A2(c)</u> The Secretary of the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission may authorize or refund permits to accommodate administrative issues.
