## BY THE COMMISSION:

above-captioned proceeding was opened by Commission, on its own motion, to determine the appropriate fees for the Recreational Vehicle Program. The Commission is charged by statute to hold an annual public hearing to determine the level of seal fee and plan review fee necessary to carry out the provisions of the Recreational Vehicle Program pursuant to the Uniform Standard Code for Recreational Vehicles Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 71-4601 to 71-4620.01 (2008 Cum. Supp.). The seal fees are subject to a statutory minimum of Ten dollars (\$10.00) and a recreational maximum of Seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per The plan review fees are subject to a statutory minimum of Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per hour and a maximum of Seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per hour.1

Notice of the proceeding appeared in <u>The Daily Record</u>, Omaha, Nebraska, on August 26, 2010. The order opening the above-captioned docket and setting the hearing was entered on August 10, 2010, and mailed to all interested parties. A Public hearing was held on September 23, 2010 in the Commission Hearing Room.

## OPINION AND FINDINGS

Mark Luttich, Director of the Commission's Housing Department, testified on behalf of the Staff. Director Luttich testified that the revenues generated by the current seal fees and plan review fees are sufficient at the current levels of Forty-five dollars (\$45.00) per seal fee and Sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per hour plan review fee. The revenues generated at the current levels are sufficient to operate the Recreational Vehicle Program, therefore, Director Luttich recommended the seal fee and plan review fee remain at the current levels.

Letters, both dated September 15, 2010, were submitted by Rich and Sons out of Grand Island, Nebraska, and Apache Camper Center with locations in Bellevue and Lincoln, Nebraska, urging the Commission to not raise the fees in the Recreational Vehicle Program at this time.

The Commission has been monitoring the situation regarding the funding of the Recreational Vehicle Program and finds that the recommendation of Director Luttich is reasonable and that the fees for the Recreational Vehicle Program should remain at the current level of Forty-five dollars (\$45.00) per seal fee and Sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per hour plan review fee.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that, pursuant to the Uniform Standard Code for Recreational Vehicles, the fees for the Recreational Vehicle Program should remain at Forty-five dollars (\$45.00) per seal fee and Sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per hour plan review fee.
