BY THE COMMISSION:

The Commission has received a letter dated July 22, 2008, from Harding & Shultz (HS) and Public Advocate's Consultant services invoices associated with the above-captioned docket, totaling \$600.00. Commission staff has reviewed the invoice and found it to conform to the Agreement for the Base Public Advocate Services dated November 15, 2004, subsequently amended, between the Commission and Harding & Shultz, as well as a Memorandum of Understanding dated May 11, 2007.
