BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 16, 2014, the Commission entered Assessment Order No. BE-005 in the amount of \$3,361.60. The order stated that the Commission had received an invoice dated August 22, 2014, from Baylor Evnen for costs associated with the above-captioned docket, totaling \$3,362.50; however due to an apparent overpayment of \$0.90 by SourceGas for a previous assessment, the current assessment was adjusted.

Upon further review, it was determined that no overpayment was made. Therefore, Commission staff recommends that Assessment Order No. BE-005 be modified and that an assessment in the amount of \$3,362.50 be approved pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. \$ 66-1840.

## OPINION AND FINDINGS

Upon the recommendation of the Commission staff, the Commission finds that Assessment Order No. BE-005 be modified as set forth herein and the assessment in the amount of \$3,362.50 from SourceGas of the expenses reflected in the above-mentioned invoice from Baylor Evnen should be approved. The Commission further finds that the Commission should pay the invoice upon receipt of payment by SourceGas.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Commission that Assessment Order No. BE-005 be modified as set forth herein and the above-mentioned assessment of \$3,362.50 is approved and hereby made and that payment be made upon receipt of payment by SourceGas Distribution, LLC.
