BY THE HEARING OFFICER:

On October 12, 2018, Black Hills Distribution LLC, d/b/a Black Hills Energy ("Black Hills") of Denver, Colorado, filed an application with the Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission") seeking an order authorizing it to adjust the System Safety and Integrity Rider Charge beginning in February of 2019.

A petition for Formal Intervention was filed by the Nebraska Public Advocate ("PA") on October 26, 2018, and the petition for intervention was granted on November 6, 2018.

**Procedural Schedule**

After the submission of the application by Black Hills, a proposed procedural schedule was circulated to Black Hills and to the PA. After consultation with the parties, there were no objections to the procedural schedule as proposed. This order serves to formalize the timeline for proceeding in this docket.

**A. Service**

Parties may meet filing deadlines outlined herein by sending an electronic copy of the filing via electronic mail to [deena.ackerman@nebraska.gov](mailto:deena.ackerman@nebraska.gov) and [sallie.dietrich@nebraska.gov](mailto:sallie.dietrich@nebraska.gov), so long as all parties are served via electronic mail contemporaneously with the email filing and a hard copy is received by the Commission within three (3) days of the email filing.

**B. Discovery**

All discovery responses are due within ten (10) days of service, unless otherwise agreed to by the Parties. Any discovery request served after 3:00 p.m. shall be considered filed the following day for purposes of calculating response time. Parties

should reference the Nebraska Court Rules of Discovery in Civil Cases for general guidance as to the conduct of discovery. Should this order conflict with any provision of said Rules, this order controls. Parties should make efforts to resolve any discovery disputes.

All parties shall provide a courtesy copy of any discovery requests and responses to the Commission. Such discovery requests and responses shall not be part of the official record unless they are offered and accepted as exhibits during the hearing on the application. ### C. Deadlines

### D. Settlement

All parties are encouraged to cooperate and engage in negotiations; however, the conduct of negotiations does not relieve the parties of their obligation to meet filing deadlines.

Parties need not identify in settlement agreements specific dollar values attached to specific issues.

**E. Hearing**

A hearing will be held in the above-captioned docket will be held in the Commission Hearing Room, 300 The Atrium, 1200 N Street, Lincoln, Nebraska, on **Tuesday, December 18, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. CDT.**

The Applicant has indicated it will arrange for a court reporter for the hearing on this matter and an expedited transcript will be provided. Therefore, the hearing fee of one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) for each half-day should be waived consistent with Commission policy.
