BY THE COMMISSION:

1. The Commission is responsible for administration of the Wireless Enhanced 911 Fund, pursuant to the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act (Act).¹ A surcharge of fifty cents per month per access line is required to be collected from customers of wireless carriers, and is used to pay for equipment and services necessary for implementing and providing enhanced wireless 911.
2. The Commission is aware that some wireless providers are imposing additional, separate surcharges and fees for enhanced 911, as well as number pooling and number portability. Neither state nor federal government mandates these additional charges. Furthermore, no government agency audits these charges as to accuracy.
3. The Commission is concerned that customers may be paying twice for enhanced 911: once under the required surcharge, and a second time when a carrier chooses to impose another fee, purportedly for the same purpose. Additionally, the Commission is concerned that wireless carriers may be recovering costs from the customers on the one hand, and then seeking costs from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund as well.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

4. The Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act provides that "The Commission shall determine the most efficient method for providing enhanced wireless 911 service,"² and further provides that "[t]he Commission shall have any powers necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of the Act."
5. The Commission finds that it should open a public investigation to explore the following issues:

- a. Should the State provide cost recovery to a wireless carrier if it is already seeking cost recovery directly from its customers?
- b. Should the Commission adopt a policy that wireless carriers collecting surcharges for E911 services must first account to the Commission before being approved for money from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund?
