OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Commission adopted a permanent funding mechanism in the above-captioned docket on February 23, 2010 for purposes of disbursing funds from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund (Fund) to eligible wireless service providers (WSPs) and public service answering points (PSAPs) pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-465(1)(e) (2008).

Funding available for each funding year is calculated utilizing the 911-SAM approved by the Commission on February 23, 2010, as amended. On May 7, 2013, the Commission entered an order authorizing payments to PSAPs and WSPs and an allocation for the WSP grant process. However, the amounts included in the order were incorrect. Subsequent to the order being entered, it was also discovered that certain adjustments to the model were necessary. The May 7, 2013 order was therefore vacated.

In the process of reviewing previously approved amounts, staff became aware that due to changes in the 911-SAM in 2012, including the annual updates, the addition of the personnel cost module, and the gradual elimination of the wireless service provider grant program, the amounts allocated to PSAPs for the 2012-2013 funding year and approved by the Commission were in excess of those amounts set forth in the 911-SAM fund forecast. As a result, PSAP payments were approximately 28% greater than forecasted. The issue did not affect payments to Modifications to the affected formulas were made for the 2013-2014 funding year. Additionally, programmatic changes were made to enhance existing quality control checks and to ensure similar issues will not arise in the future. However, it is necessary to also address the overpayment to PSAPs.

To deduct the overpayment from PSAPs without making additional funds available for distribution could significantly impact PSAPs. The fund balance remains well above the desired six month reserve. In order to mitigate the effects on PSAPs of correcting the 2012-2013 payment amounts, the Commission finds that the reserve input for the 2013-2014 funding year should be decreased, making additional funds available through the 911-SAM for PSAPs and WSPs for the 2013-2014 funding year.

Such a reduction is consistent with the Commission's previously stated intent of gradually reducing the fund balance over an approximately five year period to a six month reserve. The 2012-2013 overpayment will then be deducted from amounts allocated to PSAPs for the 2013-2014 funding year.

As a result of these adjustments, the overpayment in 2012-2013 is recaptured; PSAPs will receive approximately the same funding as was originally forecasted; and WSPs will receive slightly more than originally forecasted. The projected fund balance remains above that which is required to maintain a six month reserve.

Therefore, the Commission finds that pursuant to the 911-SAM, the following allocations are approved for the 2013-2014 funding year: \$5,986,458 to eligible PSAPs; \$1,054,736 to eligible WSPs and \$346,743 for the WSP grant process. The amount allocated to PSAPs will be reduced by \$1,213,550 to recapture the 2012-2013 overpayment, leaving \$4,772,908 in potential payments to PSAPs. Although the adjusted amount appears to be a nearly 15% decrease when compared to the actual amounts paid in 2012-2013, when compared to the original forecasted amount of \$4,366,207 for the same period, this year's funding represents an approximate 9% increase.

Potential payments to individual PSAPs will be adjusted further to account for pre-existing payments. Attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference are Appendix A, outlining the E911 Fund Forecast; Appendix B, a summary of the potential funding to each PSAP incorporating all pre-existing commitments for in the 2013-14 funding year; and Appendix C outlining WSP Support.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the adjustments set forth herein are approved and staff is authorized to make disbursements for the 2013-2014 funding year as described in this order.

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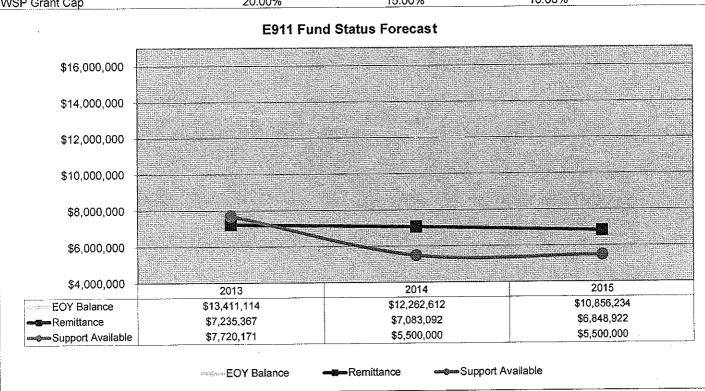
