BY THE COMMISSION:

On December 13, 2005, the Nebraska Public Service Commission approved a written request received from Merrick County, Central City for funding, from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund (Fund) for expenses to develop and maintain Geographical Information System (GIS) data necessary for the implementation of Phase II wireless enhanced 911. On August 23, 2006, the County filed a request for reimbursement of initial charges paid by the County in the amount of \$12,150.00 for the initial development of GIS data undertaken by the County prior to seeking funding.

Payment was made by the County to GeoComm and documentation of the payment has been provided. Further, Merrick County has submitted a copy of the contract with GeoComm for development of the data and a written verification that it has received the GIS data from GeoComm and that it contains all necessary map layers.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

This request for funding is being processed pursuant to $\underline{\text{Neb}}$. $\underline{\text{Rev}}$. $\underline{\text{Stat}}$. $\underline{\text{SS}}$ 86-442 to 86-469 (2006 Supp.), 291 Neb. Admin. Code, Chapter 1, Section 5, Progression Order No. 5 in Commission Docket No. 911-001, entered July 16, 2002 and, the October 18, 2005 order Adopting Guidelines for GIS Funding in Docket No. 911-011.

Costs requested are eligible under $\underline{\text{Neb}}$. $\underline{\text{Rev}}$. $\underline{\text{Stat}}$. § 86-465 (2006 Supp.). All costs have been incurred for the development of GIS data which is necessary for the future implementation of Phase II wireless enhanced 911 service.

Because Merrick County has already paid GeoComm for the initial GIS data development, the Commission finds that payment should be made to Merrick County in the amount of \$12,150.00.

The Commission and its authorized staff shall have access to all data developed. Additionally, agencies and political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska, to the extent allowed by law and by agreement of the parties, shall have access to data as deemed appropriate by the Commission. The data and all updates shall be provided for inclusion in the centralized GIS data repository.

If the Nebraska Legislature fails to appropriate or authorize the expenditure of sufficient funds to provide for the payment of costs from the Fund for GIS development or if a lawful order issued in or for any fiscal year during the term of the contract for services reduces the funds appropriated or authorized in such amounts as to preclude making the payments from the Fund, the Commission will not be responsible for any costs not reimbursed by the Fund.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the request for funding of Merrick County shall be approved consistent with the terms outlined herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission shall remit to Antelope County from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund \$12,150.00.
