BY THE COMMISSION:

By written request for funding received February 11, 2009, Furnas County Public Safety Answering Point, Beaver City (Furnas County), sought funding from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund for expenses for implementing and providing enhanced wireless 911 service.

In its application, Furnas County seeks \$7,608.00 for software maintenance for the period commencing March, 2009 through March, 2010.

Furnas County provided supporting documentation for the expenses. The Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board considered Furnas County's request at its April 6, 2009 meeting and recommended that the Commission approve payment in full. Subsequently, on April 13, 2009, Furnas County filed an updated funding request replacing the February 11th request seeking a reduced amount of \$6,300.00.

The costs are consistent with the vendor's response to the Commission's Request for Proposal (RFP) and other similar requests.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

This request for additional funding is being processed pursuant to $\underline{\text{Neb}}$. $\underline{\text{Rev}}$. $\underline{\text{Stat}}$. §§ 86-442 to 86-470. (Cum. Supp. 2008), 291 Neb. Admin. Code, Chapter 1, Section 5, Progression Order No. 5 in Commission Docket No. 911-001, entered July 16, 2002 and the Interim Policy established in Progression Order No. 1 in Commission Docket No. 911-017/PI-116, entered February 13, 2007 (Interim Policy).

Based upon the request for funding, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that costs requested, subject to the limitations set forth below, are eligible under Neb. Rev. Stat. Stat

operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service.

Furnas County's request includes costs associated with a one (1) year maintenance and service plan for software. The Commission finds that maintenance of the equipment and software is essential to ensure the proper operation of the statewide 911 system and should be funded to the extent funds are available during this interim period, subject to change based upon the availability of funds and the permanent funding mechanism.

Therefore, the request for funding should be granted in the amount of \$6,300.00 in for software maintenance subject to the limitations set forth herein.

The Fund shall therefore pay to Furnas County, or its designee, the amount of \$6,300.00 consistent with the terms of this order. Furnas County may request that these amounts be paid directly to the vendor.

The Commission reserves the right to modify any costs associated with this funding request consistent with amendments to the Interim Policy or the establishment of a permanent funding mechanism.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund shall pay to Furnas County or its designee the amount of \$6,300.00 consistent with the terms of this order for software maintenance.
