BY THE COMMISSION:

By written request for funding dated February 15, 2007, Thurston County, Pender, sought funding from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund for expenses for implementing and providing enhanced wireless 911 service.

In its application, Thurston County sought non-recurring in the amount of \$122,649.98 for the purchase and installation of equipment and software necessary to implement enhanced wireless 911 service. Of that amount, **\$4,638.13** was of System. attributable to the purchase а Norstar Phone Additionally, Thurston County seeks reimbursement of \$30,000.00 for GIS data development.

Thurston County provided supporting documentation for the equipment and associated expenses from its vendors. Furthermore, Thurston County has provided documentation showing that it has already made payment of the amounts sought. The Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board considered Thurston County's request at its March 23, 2007 meeting and recommended that the Commission approve payment in the amount of \$133,011.86.

costs of several items listed in the supporting documentation exceed the prices contained in the vendor's response to the Commission's Request for Proposal (RFP). All costs request contained within the for funding and supporting the confidential attachment documentation are set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Those items listed in italics are priced above the RFP pricing.

Based upon the supporting documentation it appears that of the \$30,000.00 requested for GIS data development, \$15,000.00 was attributable to creation of the MSAG and public relations assistance and is therefore not eligible for reimbursement. Thurston County entered into a contract for services with GIS Workshop, Inc. (GIS Workshop) for the development and maintenance

of GIS Data and has provided a copy of the contract with its request for funding.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

This request for additional funding is being processed pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-442 to 86-470. (Cum. Supp. 2006), 291 Neb. Admin. Code, Chapter 1, Section 5, Progression Order No. 5 in Commission Docket No. 911-001, entered July 16, 2002 and the Interim Policy established in Progression Order No. 1 in Commission Docket No. 911-017/PI-116, entered February 13, 2007 (Interim Policy).

Based upon the request for funding, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that costs requested, subject to the limitations set forth below, are eligible under $\underline{\text{Neb}}$. $\underline{\text{Rev}}$. $\underline{\text{Stat}}$. $\underline{\text{S}}$ 86-465 as all costs have been incurred or will be incurred for the purchase, installation, maintenance or operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service.

This funding request was received prior to February 16, 2007. Pursuant to the Interim Policy, the Commission therefore considers this funding request for full reimbursement without being subject to the wireless/landline allocation factor established in the Commission's February 17, 2007 order.

The Commission finds that the funding request shall be granted only to the extent the pricing complies with the vendor's responses to RFP. The Commission finds that costs attributable to addressing and the purchase and installation of a telephone system are not eligible for funding.

Therefore, the request for funding should be granted in part in the amount of \$110,969.81 in non recurring costs for equipment and software and \$15,000.00 in non recurring costs for GIS data development subject to the limitations set forth herein. Said amounts are consistent with the pricing set forth in the vendor's response to the RFP. However, this amount does not include costs associated any amounts requested in excess of the prices offered in response to the RFP as outlined in Appendix A, any amounts attributable to addressing, or any amounts attributable to the purchase and installation of a telephone system.

The Fund shall therefore pay to Thurston County or its designee the amount of \$125,969.81 consistent with the terms of this order and the amounts set forth in Appendix A.

Should Thurston County wish to be heard by the Commission regarding those portions of the funding request related to the amounts in excess of the prices offered in the response to the RFP, amounts attributable to addressing or amounts attributable to the telephone system it shall notify the Commission in writing within fifteen (15) days of this order and the matter will be set for hearing.

The Commission and its authorized staff shall have access to all GIS data developed. Additionally, agencies and political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska, to the extent allowed by law and by agreement of the parties, shall have access to data as deemed appropriate by the Commission. The data and all updates shall be provided for inclusion in the centralized GIS data repository.

If the Nebraska Legislature fails to appropriate or authorize the expenditure of sufficient funds to provide for the payment of costs from the Fund for GIS development and maintenance or if a lawful order issued in or for any fiscal year during the term of the contract for services reduces the funds appropriated or authorized in such amounts as to preclude making the payments from the Fund, the Commission will not be responsible for any costs not reimbursed by the Fund.

The Commission reserves the right to modify any amounts approved herein in the future, consistent with the permanent funding mechanism established pursuant to LB 1222 [2006].

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund shall pay to Thurston County or its designee the amount of \$125,969.81 consistent with the terms of this order and the amounts set forth in Appendix A for the equipment, software, and GIS data necessary to provide enhanced wireless 911 service.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED should Thurston County wish to be heard by the Commission regarding those portions of the funding request not approved herein, it shall notify the Commission in writing within fifteen (15) days of this order and the matter will be set for hearing.
