O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

On April 14, 2010, the South Sioux City/Dakota County Law Enforcement Center Board and the joint city/county Public Safety Answering Point (South Sioux City) filed its application for funding with the Commission pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

South Sioux City, which services the areas of Dakota County, is eligible for funding in the amount of \$46,682.52 for the 2010-11 funding year. South Sioux City has indicated that it anticipates using the funding provided for the following purposes: seventy-one percent (71%) to support contracts for 911 telephony hardware and software, GIS software and data maintenance, and for other equipment, software, and training that would assist in providing wireless 911 service, and that it plans to set aside the remainder of its funding for future equipment and software upgrades and purchases.

Prior funding commitments in the amount of \$3,942.00 were previously approved and must be deducted from the allocation.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that funding request for South Sioux City in the amount of \$42,740.52 should be approved consistent with the allocation determined in Docket 911-019/PI-118.

Pursuant to Docket 911-019/PI-118, South Sioux City is required to submit documentation to justify expenditures, including an accounting of funds set aside for future equipment

and software purchases, and update contact and other information no later than the October 15 following the close of the funding year. If the Commission determines that any funds were not used appropriately, funding for the following funding year will be adjusted to recoup any necessary funds. All PSAPs are subject to audit.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for the South Sioux City/Dakota County Law Enforcement Center Board and the joint city/county Public Safety Answering Point is hereby approved as set forth herein in the amount of \$42,740.52.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that South Sioux City submit required documentation to justify all expenditures with approved funds no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with the terms of the order approving the permanent funding mechanism and process in Docket 911-019/PI-118 entered on February 23, 2010.
