BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about December 19, 2017, the City of Grand Island ("Grand Island") public safety answering point ("PSAP") filed a request seeking approval for the use of enhanced wireless 911 set-aside funds toward the purchase of computer hardware and software components to refresh the Grand Island PSAP's Motorola Emergency Callworks ("Motorola") customer premise equipment. According to a pricing summary dated March 30, 2017, provided to Grand Island by Motorola, the total cost of equipment and installation would be \$41,160.12.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the Grand Island request at its February 20, 2018, meeting and recommended that the request be approved.

The costs sought are shared costs subject to the wireless/wireline ratio. The Grand Island wireless/wireline ratio for the 2017-2018 funding year is 81% wireless.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

The Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) adopted the permanent cost model to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.¹

Based upon the request, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the costs requested are eligible for funding as costs have been incurred for the purchase, installation, maintenance or operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service.²

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Pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism, PSAPs are permitted to retain up to seventy-five percent (75%) of the annual funding amount allocated to that PSAP for the future purchase of equipment and software.³

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that the Grand Island request to use set-aside funds for the purchase of computer hardware and software components should be approved in the amount of **\$33,339.70**, representing 81% of \$41,160.12, based on the wireless/wireline ratio on file with the Commission.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for the use of set aside funds by Grand Island is hereby approved as set forth herein in an amount not to exceed **\$33,339.70**.
