BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

On March 23, 2011, the City of Falls City (Falls City) filed its application for funding with the Commission pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

Falls City, which serves Richardson County, is eligible for funding in the amount of up to \$32,397.89 for the 2011-12 funding year. Falls City has indicated that it anticipates using the funding provided for the following purposes: to update CAD software to interface with 911 software and add cards to NICE recorder. Falls City plans to set aside 75% of its funding for future equipment and software upgrades and purchases.

Falls City has not yet implemented enhanced wireless 911 but is in the process of doing so. As such, no payment can be made to the city until such implementation is completed. The eligible funding will be prorated based upon the date of implementation and the city will not receive the full allocation.

Prior funding commitments in the amount of \$5,000.00 were previously approved and must be deducted from the allocation.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that the funding request for Falls City in the amount of up to \$27,397.89, should be approved consistent with the allocation determined in Docket 911-019/PI-118. Payments of a prorated amount will commence once implementation of wireless enhanced 911 services is complete.

Falls City is responsible for notifying the Commission once implementation has taken place.

Pursuant to Docket 911-019/PI-118, Falls City is required to submit documentation to justify expenditures, including an accounting of funds set aside for future equipment and software purchases, and update contact and other information no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year. If the Commission determines that any funds were not used appropriately, funding for the following funding year will be adjusted to recoup any necessary funds. All PSAPs are subject to audit.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for Falls City is hereby approved as set forth herein in the amount of up to \$27,397.89.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that payments of a prorated amount will commence once implementation of wireless enhanced 911 service has occurred and Falls City has notified the Commission.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that Falls City submit required documentation to justify all expenditures with approved funds no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with the terms of the order approving the permanent funding mechanism and process in Docket 911-019/PI-118 entered on February 23, 2010.
