OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism.¹

On April 16, 2012, Dundy County filed its application for funding with the Commission pursuant to Neb. Admin. Code Title 291, Ch. 15 § 007.01. Dundy County serves Dundy County.

Pending resolution of the issues currently being considered in Docket No. 911-019/PI-118², Dundy County is eligible for interim funding in the amount of \$17,130.63 for the 2012-13 funding year. This amount reflects the deduction of pre-existing commitments totaling \$6,790.33. Dundy County has indicated that it anticipates using the funding provided for the following purposes: PSAP billing for telecommunications services, equipment maintenance and replacement and training. The county plans to set aside 75% of its funding for future equipment and software upgrades and purchases.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that funding request for Dundy County in the amount of \$17,130.63 should be approved consistent with the allocation previously approved by the Commission in Application No. $911-019/PI-118^3$. Dundy County shall

Once a final decision is made regarding modifications to the model and allocations for the 2012-13 funding year, the Commission will true-up funding amounts for PSAPs including but not limited to making any adjustments for pre-existing commitments that may have expired or otherwise changed, for any adjustments necessary based upon the audit for the 2010-11 funding year, deductions from funding for any late filed applications, and for any change in allocation resulting from the addition of the personnel cost module. All true-ups will be made retroactively to July 1, 2012.

Dundy County is required to submit documentation to justify expenditures, including an accounting of funds set aside for future equipment and software purchases, and update contact and other information no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with Neb. Admin. Code, Title 291, Ch. 15 § 008. If the Commission determines that any funds were not used appropriately, funding for the following funding year will be adjusted to recoup any necessary funds. All PSAPs are subject to audit.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for Dundy County is hereby approved as set forth herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Dundy County must submit required documentation to justify all expenditures with approved funds no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with Neb. Admin. Code, Title 291, Ch. 15 § 008.
