BY THE COMMISSION:

The Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opens the above-captioned docket, on its own motion to investigate the affect of statewide prepaid wireless subscriber counts on local exchange carrier payments for enhanced wireless 911 service under the permanent funding mechanism and quarterly reporting requirements.

On February 23, 2010, the Commission entered an order adopting a permanent funding mechanism for the implementation and provision of enhanced wireless 911 service as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-465(1)(e) (2008).

The Commission held that payments to local exchange carriers (LECs) on behalf of PSAPs would be made on a quarterly basis in arrears based upon the number of wireless subscribers found in quarterly reports filed by wireless service providers. Such an approach eliminated the need for invoicing. Therefore, the Commission required each of the LECs to file a tariffed rate.

The approach was based upon the expectation that all wireless subscribers would be reported on a county by county basis and could therefore be allocated to the appropriate LEC. However, it was determined that certain prepaid wireless carriers could not provide the county by county breakdown of subscribers.

As a result, on September 21, 2010 the Commission entered Progression Order No. 2 in Docket No. 911-019/PI-118 clarifying that the rates established by the LECs and payments made to LECs would be based upon the number of subscribers capable of being reported on a county by county basis but would exclude the prepaid wireless subscribers that could not be provided on a county bases representing approximately 1% of total subscribers in Nebraska. Such an approach will be utilized pending the outcome of the present investigation.

In order to develop appropriate methods for addressing the issues, the Commission seeks comment regarding the following:

- 1. What other reporting options exist for wireless carriers providing prepaid wireless services who are unable to report subscribers on a county basis that would permit the subscribers to be properly assigned to the LEC for the purpose of setting rates for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 services and making payment for the services?
- 2. In the event that no reporting option is available, what methods could be used for the allocation of subscribers reported on a statewide basis to the appropriate LEC for the purpose of setting rates for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 services and making payment for the services?
 - 3. Any other issues that should be addressed.
