BY THE COMMISSION:

On May 6, 2014, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) entered an order on its own motion seeking to investigate and determine whether additional funds from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund<sup>1</sup> should be made available to public safety answering points (PSAPs) for costs to implement text to 911 solutions.<sup>2</sup>

On November 4, 2014, the Commission released Progression Order No. 3 in this docket, setting out the procedure to fund text to 911 outside the cost model for PSAPs ready to implement technology solutions on an interim basis. The staff proposal adopted set out the application process for PSAPs seeking interim funding for text to 911 solutions.<sup>3</sup>

On or about April 19, 2018, the Kearney County PSAP ("Kearney") submitted an application in this docket requesting text to 911 funding for an integrated direct IP solution. The application listed \$2,397.62 in non-recurring costs and annual recurring costs totaling \$4,500.00, representing recurring costs of \$1500.00 per year for three years.

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The application was reviewed by technical subject matter experts, Mission Critical Partners ("MCP"), who advised that the Kearney proposal is technically viable and provides complete integration with the PSAP's current call handling equipment.

The Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board considered Kearney's funding request at its May 14, 2018 meeting and recommended that the Commission approve the funding request.

O P I N I O N S   A N D   F I N D I N G S

According to Neb. Rev. Stat. 86-465(2), costs incurred by public safety answering points for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service may be eligible for payment from the 911 Service System Fund, according to standards and criteria established by the Commission.

Pursuant to the staff proposal adopted in Progression Order No. 3 in this docket, the Commission may approve funding requests for text to 911 technology solutions costs such as text control center contracts, staff training, trunks necessary for additional text traffic, other costs related to the provision of text to 911 services not attributed more generally to 911 emergency response services. Progression Order No. 3 further specified that the Commission intended to limit approval of text to 911 related service contracts to no more than three years.

The Commission finds the application submitted by Kearney contains eligible costs under the interim text to 911 funding orders. PSAPs must submit invoices for payment by the Commission or submit invoices with evidence of payment for reimbursement to the PSAP from the 911 Service System Fund.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the text to 911 technology solution funding request submitted by Kearney County be, and hereby is, approved in an amount not to exceed \$2,397.62 non-recurring costs, plus a total of \$4,500.00 in recurring costs over a three-year period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Kearney County submit required documentation to justify all expenditures for payment or reimbursement from the 911 Service System Fund.
