## OPINION AND FINDINGS

- 1. On May 15, 2007, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) established a detailed process for verifying whether all federal high-cost support was, in the preceding year, and would be in the next calendar year, used for the purpose pursuant to Section 254 (e) Telecommunications Act of 1996; and whether all state highcost support was and would be used for its intended purpose pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-324. See Application Nos. NUSF-25/NUSF-66, Progression Order #18 (May 15, Consistent with the Commission's findings all designated eligible telecommunications carriers (ETCs) and all Nebraska eligible telecommunications carriers designated receiving high-cost support were required to file historical and prospective documentation describing their use of federal and state high-cost universal service support. These annual filings are due on June 1st of each year.
- 2. By June 1st of this year, each eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) and each Nebraska eligible telecommunications carrier (NETC) were required to file with the NTIPS Department, an adequate description of how the high-

cost funding support has been used and an adequate description of how high-cost support will be used during the coming year.

- 3. November 2011, the 18, Federal Communications Commission (FCC) issued its Universal Service and Intercarrier Compensation Transformation Order (Transformation which, inter alia, modified the certification requirements for ETCs. Among the changes 47 C.F.R. § 54.314 requires state commissions, after conducting a detailed review of ETC's historical and prospective documentation describing the use of federal universal service support, to determine whether universal service support was used for its intended purpose in the preceding calendar year and will be used for its intended purpose in the following calendar year.
- 4. Pursuant to the requirements established by the FCC, ETCs were required to file their annual Form 481 reports with the Commission on or before July  $1^{\rm st}$  of this year.
- Upon completion of its review, the Commission finds that following carrier adequately filed information demonstrating that they will use<sup>3</sup> all federal high-cost universal service support in the coming year provision, maintenance and upgrading of facilities services for which support is intended, pursuant to 47 C.F.R § 54.314 (May 8, 2012) and WC Docket No. 10-90:

6. Accordingly, the Commission will provide certification to the Administrator of the federal high-cost universal service support mechanisms and the FCC, that the above-listed carrier will use federal high-cost universal service support in the

coming year (2017) only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and/or service for which the support is intended in accordance with § 254(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, as amended.

7. Certification in this Order shall not be construed as precedent as to the sufficiency of the information considered acceptable by the Commission in subsequent years.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the Department certify to the Administrator of the federal high-cost universal service support mechanisms and the Federal Communications Commission, that the above-listed eligible telecommunications carriers will use in the coming year federal high-cost support only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and/or service for which the support is intended in accordance with § 254(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, as amended.
