Clarification of the Motion
of the Nebraska Hospital
Association, et al for
Approval of its Statewide
Telehealth Plan

This motion is being filed to clarify a motion made on July 9, 2004 by the Nebraska Hospital Association to seek approval for the support of certain telecommunications services to connect all rural hospitals. In comments filed October 24, 2002, the Nebraska Hospital Association requested support for certain hospitals designated as "Critical Access Hospitals" and for rural hospitals not designated as "Critical Access Hospitals". Rural hospitals include all rural hospitals designated as "Critical Access Hospitals", and rural hospitals not designated as "Critical Access Hospitals" that are eligible for Federal Universal Service Fund support for telecommunications services with the exception of Veterans Administration Hospitals, Indian Service Hospitals and the State of Nebraska's Regional Centers.

On December 17, 2002, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) entered Progression Order Number 3 in the above captioned proceeding. In that Order the Commission found it in the public's interest to allocate a portion of the monies from the Nebraska Universal Service Fund (NUSF) to promote affordable telecommunications access for <a href="mailto:rural hospitals">rural hospitals</a> to larger health care facilities. The Commission found that an allocation of support would have a favorable impact on affordability of rates. The Commission found that monetary support for advanced telecommunications services will pass through communities, will promote quality health care in rural Nebraska communities, and benefit rural Nebraska communities overall.

The Commission directed the NUSF Department, all NETCs, and the Nebraska Hospital Association (NHA) to work together to develop a specific plan or plans for support approval not to exceed \$900,000 per calendar year. Any other telecommunications provider was not to be precluded from participating and seeking designation of a NETC. On May 23, 2003, the NHA filed a plan for initial approval, which included support for all rural hospitals consistent with the \$900,000 limitation. The NHA has worked with the NUSF Department to clarify issues and has worked with all

interested hospitals, NETCs, the Nebraska Information Network, the Nebraska Information Technology Commission (NITC), the Telehealth Subcommittee of the NITC Community Counsel, and the State of Nebraska to produce details of the projected costs of the telecommunications services for fiscal year 2003-04 and for details of a plan for the authorization of costs not to exceed an authorized amount for fiscal year 2004-05. As specified in the plan attached to the July 9, 2004 motion, certain hospitals are also included for the purpose of connecting rural hospitals into a statewide communication network.

As required by the Commission in Progression Order Number 3:

- 1. The cost or authorization of expenditures requested by the NHA will not exceed the \$900,000 per calendar year allocated by the Commission.
- 2. The grant of NUSF support is supplemental and secondary to the receipt of Federal Universal Service Fund support, grants and other available monetary sources.
- 3. Rural hospitals demonstrate that they are first availing themselves of any accessible federal support and grant monies.
- 4. All rural hospitals are responsible for picking up a reasonable portion of their costs for connectivity.

The NHA respectfully requests the authorization of specific monetary payments to NETCs as outlined in the plan attached to its motion dated July 9, 2004 for telecommunications services provided in fiscal year 2003-04 and for authorization of projected monetary payments in fiscal year 2004-05 not to exceed the amounts outlined in its filing and motion dated July 9, 2004.
