BY THE COMMISSION:

On November 4, 2014, the Commission issued an Order permitting the use of wireless surcharge funds to provide text-to-911 capability to public safety answering points ("PSAPs") on an interim basis outside the cost model, with the proviso that duration of such interim PSAP funding for text-to-911 service contracts was limited to three years.

On November 19, 2018, the Commission issued an Order indefinitely extending the interim text-to-911 funding mechanism for PSAPs.² The Order provided that PSAPs that had previously received text-to-911 funding would be permitted to submit applications to extend or revise such funding for one or more additional period(s), not to exceed three years each.³

The Commission approved text-to-911 funding for the City of Lincoln PSAP via an Order issued on October 12, 2016, 4 as amended on January 10, 2017. 5

On or about January 25, 2019, the City of Lincoln PSAP submitted a request for an extension of its interim text-to-911 funding at a monthly cost of \$136.44.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Based on the above, the Commission finds that text-to-911 funding for the City of Lincoln PSAP should be extended in an amount not to exceed \$136.44 per month, for a period no longer than three years, which equates to a total of no more than \$4,911.84. As was the case prior to any such extension, PSAPs are required to either submit invoices for payment by the Commission or submit invoices with evidence of payment for reimbursement to the PSAP from the 911 Service System Fund.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that interim text-to-911 funding for the City of Lincoln PSAP be, and is hereby, extended for a maximum of three years at a monthly cost not to exceed \$136.44, which equates to a three year maximum of \$4,911.84.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the City of Lincoln submit required documentation to justify all expenditures for payment or reimbursement from the 911 Service System Fund.
