O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

On March 31, 2019, the Public Safety Answering Point ("PSAP") providing 911 service to Boone County filed an application for annual 911 funding with the Commission. On May 7, 2019, the Commission approved an annual allocation of 911 funding for Boone County in the amount of \$46,478.44 for the 2019-2020 funding year.¹

On or about June 4, 2019, Nance County informed the Commission that it had consolidated its 911 services with Boone County, effective June 1, 2019. As a result, Boone County now answers and dispatches all 911 calls for Nance County, and has done so since June 1, 2019.

On May 7, 2019, Nance County was allocated \$39,740.72 for the provision of 911 services within the county for the 2019-2020 funding year.² Because Nance County no longer has an operating public safety answering point ("PSAP"), the county's funding allocation for the 2019-2020 funding year should be transferred to

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Boone County, which is now responsible for providing 911 services in Nance County.³

Based on the above, the Commission finds the Nance County annual funding allocation for the 2019-2020 funding year in the amount of \$39,740.72 shall be transferred to Boone County and added to Boone County's annual funding allocation for the provision of 911 services for the 2019-2020 funding year. The funding previously approved for Boone County is hereby amended to **\$86,219.16**, to be paid in eleven monthly installments of \$7,838.10.





O R D E R
