O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

On April 11 2019, Nance County filed an application for annual 911 funding with the Commission. On May 7, 2019, the Commission approved an annual allocation of 911 funding for the provision of 911 services in Nance County in the amount \$39,740.72 for the 2019-2020 funding year.

On or about June 4, 2019, Nance County informed the Commission that it had closed its public safety answering point ("PSAP") and officially consolidated its 911 services with Boone County, effective on June 1, 2019. As a result, the Boone County PSAP now answers and dispatches all 911 calls for Nance County, and has done so since June 1, 2019.

Because Nance County no longer has its own PSAP, funding previously allocated to provide 911 services in Nance County for the 2019-2020 funding year should be transferred to Boone County and added to the Boone County 911 funding allocation for the 2019-2020 funding year. In addition, Boone County should also receive any remaining wireless 911 funds held by Nance County after making any adjustments that may be required based on the completion of a final audit of the Nance County accounts.

Based on the above, the Commission finds the Nance County annual funding allocation for the 2019-2020 funding year in the amount of **\$39,740.72** shall be transferred to Boone County and added to Boone County's annual funding allocation for the

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provision of 911 services for the 2019-2020 funding year.¹ In addition, all remaining 911 funds held by Nance County, after making any required adjustments based on a final audit, shall be transferred to Boone County by Nance County.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that funding for Nance County is hereby ceased.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Nance County's annual funding allocation for the provision of 911 services for the 2019-2020 funding year in the amount of **\$39,740.72** shall be transferred to Boone County and added to Boone County's annual funding for the 2019-2020 funding year

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all remaining 911 funds held by Nance County, after making any required adjustments based on a final audit, shall be transferred to Boone County by Nance County.
