BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about October 10, 2019, the Public Safety Answering Point ("PSAP") operated by the Dodge County 911 Board ("Dodge County") filed a request to use set-aside funds to help pay for upgrades to their VIPER call handling equipment. The total cost of the upgrade will be \$132,972.24.

Such costs sought are shared costs subject to the wireless/wireline ratio. Dodge County's wireless ratio for the 2019-2020 funding year of 83% wireless. Therefore, after application of the wireless/wireline ratio, the maximum amount of set-aside funds that Dodge County could apply to this request would be \$110,366.96. However, Dodge County has limited its funding request to the County's current set-aside fund balance of \$54,697.00.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the request at its October 21, 2019, meeting and recommended the request be approved.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Pursuant to the 911 Service system Act¹ (the "Act"), the Commission is responsible for allocating funding to PSAPs from the 911 Service System Fund (the "Fund").² The Fund consists primarily of surcharges collected by wireless carriers from wireless service customers.³ The Act provides that money in the

fund may be used to pay for costs that are determined by the Public Service Commission ("Commission") to be eligible for funding, including costs incurred by PSAPs for acquisition, installation, maintenance, and operation of telecommunications equipment and services required for the provision of 911 service.⁴

The funding mechanism adopted by the Commission permits PSAPs to set aside up to seventy-five percent (75%) of their annual funding allocation for future purchases of equipment and software. ⁵ As stated above, the current set-aside fund balance for Dodge County is \$54,697.00.

Based on the request for funding and supporting documentation, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the costs requested are eligible under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1025(5)(c) as costs that have been incurred or will be incurred for the acquisition of new equipment and related maintenance costs and license fees, and/or the acquisition, installation, maintenance, operation of telecommunications equipment telecommunications service required for the provision of 911 service.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that Dodge County's request to use set-aside funds should be approved in an amount of up to \$54,697.00.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for Dodge County is hereby approved in an amount not to exceed \$54,697.00.
