BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about July 22, 2020, the Dawes County ("Dawes") Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) filed a request with the Public Service Commission ("Commission") to use enhanced wireless 911 setaside funds to pay for Dawes's cost of joining the aggregated regional Geographic Information Systems (GIS) data hub operated by GeoComm in the South Central Region (the "Data Hub"), Dawes is seeking authorization to pay GeoComm a total of \$3,407.00, representing a one-time configuration charge of \$736.00, plus \$2,671.00 for the first year of service. Dawes will be incurring these costs in order to join the South Central Region.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the Dawes funding request at its August 19, 2020 meeting and recommended that the requested funding be approved.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission") adopted the current method of providing funding to PSAPs for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118 on February 23, 2010. PSAPs are permitted to set aside up to seventy-five percent (75%) of their annual funding allocation for the future purchase of equipment and

software.³ Set aside funds may also be used to pay the first year of multi-year maintenance, support, service or license agreements.⁴ Also, up to 100 percent of eligible costs, including GIS costs, incurred by a PSAP to join a region may be paid from set aside funds, without applying the wireless/wireline ratio.⁵

Based upon the request for funding, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission finds that the costs requested are eligible to be paid from Dawes's set aside funds, without applying the wireless/wireline ratio. Therefore, the Commission finds that use of set-aside funding by Dawes should be approved in an amount up to \$3,407.00.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that funding for Dawes County is hereby approved as set forth herein in the amount of up to \$3,407.00.
