BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about July 10, 2020, the Public Safety Answering Point ("PSAP") operated by Butler County filed a request to use setaside funds for the purchase of a Computer Assisted Dispatch ("CAD") system from Zuercher Technologies. The total cost of the CAD system is \$113,864.00, but the Butler County funding request states that they wish to apply set-aside funds only to the third and final payment for purchase of the CAD system, the amount of which is \$22,772.80. Butler County is also requesting to use setaside funds to purchase computer equipment for the CAD system from Applied Connective Technologies, at a cost of \$2,650.00. The combined cost of the CAD system and computer equipment is \$25,422.80. In addition, Butler County is requesting the use of set-aside funds to pay annual maintenance costs on the CAD system in the amount of \$16,173.00.

The purchase of the CAD system and computer equipment is subject to the wireless/wireline ratio. The wireless/wireline ratio for Butler for the 2020-2021 funding year is 78%.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the request at its August 19, 2020, meeting and recommended the request be approved.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Pursuant to the 911 Service System Act^1 (the "Act"), the Commission is responsible for allocating funding to PSAPs from the 911 Service System Fund (the "Fund"). The Fund consists primarily of surcharges collected by wireless carriers from wireless service

customers.³ The Act provides that money in the fund may be used to pay for costs that are determined by the Public Service Commission ("Commission") to be eligible for funding, including costs incurred by PSAPs for acquisition, installation, maintenance, and operation of telecommunications equipment and services required for the provision of 911 service.⁴

PSAPs can set aside up to seventy-five percent (75%) of their annual funding allocation for future purchases of equipment and software.⁵ PSAP costs for CAD systems are eligible for funding pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.⁶ After applying Butler County's wireless/wireline ratio of 78 percent, the amount of setaside funds that may be used for the purchase of the CAD system and computer equipment is \$19,829.78.

As stated above, Butler County also requested the use of set-aside funds to pay for \$16,173.00 of maintenance costs for the CAD system. However, the documentation Butler County provided with its funding request shows that such maintenance costs apply beginning with the second year of operation. Set-aside funds may be used to pay for only the first year of multi-year maintenance, support, service or licensing costs. After the first year, maintenance, support, licensing, extended warranties and the like must be paid from a PSAP's annually allocated funds or other sources. Therefore, the requested \$16,173.00 of year two maintenance costs are not eligible to be paid from set-aside funds.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that use of set-aside funding by Butler should be approved in an amount up to \$19,829.78.
