BY THE COMMISSION:

On March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission") opened the above-referenced docket on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points ("PSAPs"). 1

On or about October 16, 2020, the City of McCook PSAP filed a request to use set-aside funds for the purchase of a NICE Inform logging recorder from Voice Products, Inc. for \$18,478.00, including first year maintenance.

Loggers are an eligible use of 911 funds.² However, 911 funds may only be used to pay the 911 portion of the cost for equipment that is used for multiple purposes.³ The City of McCook reports that approximately forty-five percent (45%) of the logger's use will be devoted to 911 purposes. Therefore, the portion of the purchase price that corresponds to 911 usage is 45 percent of \$18,478.00 which is \$8,315.10.

The cost of a logger is also a shared cost that is subject to the wireless/wireline ratio. The wireless/wireline ratio for City of McCook for the 2020-2021 funding year is 61 percent wireless. Therefore, the portion of the purchase price that is eligible for

funding using the City of McCook's wireless 911 set-aside funds is 61 percent of \$8,315.10, which is \$5,072.21.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the request at its October 21, 2020 meeting and recommended the request be approved.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Pursuant to the 911 Service System Act⁴ (the "Act"), the Commission is responsible for allocating funding to PSAPs from the 911 Service System Fund (the "Fund").⁵ The Fund consists primarily of surcharges collected by wireless carriers from wireless service customers.⁶ The Act provides that money in the fund may be used to pay for costs that are determined by the Public Service Commission ("Commission") to be eligible for funding, including costs incurred by PSAPs for acquisition, installation, maintenance, and operation of telecommunications equipment and services required for the provision of 911 service.⁷

The funding mechanism adopted by the Commission permits PSAPs to set aside up to seventy-five percent (75%) of their annual funding allocation for future purchases of equipment and software. Set aside funds may also be used to pay the first year of multi-year maintenance, service, support or licensing agreements. However, set aside funds may not be used to pay future years of multi-year maintenance, service, support or licensing agreements. Any such future costs must be paid from a PSAP's annually allocated funds or other sources. 10

Based upon the request for funding, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the costs requested are eligible for funding as costs incurred for the purchase, installation, maintenance or operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of 911 service.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that use of setaside funds by City of McCook should be approved in an amount not to exceed \$5,072.21.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that funding for the City of McCook is hereby approved in an amount not to exceed \$5,072.21.
