O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened this docket on its own motion¹ to administer funding for public safety answering points (PSAPs) to implement and provide Enhanced Wireless 911 Service pursuant to the funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118 on February 23, 2010.²

On May 5, 2020, the Commission approved an annual allocation of wireless 911 funding for Cheyenne County in the amount of \$55,787.00 for the 2020-2021 funding year.³ Such funding was divided into eleven equal monthly payments of \$5,072.00, from July 2020 through May 2021.

It has recently come to the Commission's attention that 911 service in Deuel County, which formerly was provided by the Keith County PSAP, is now being provided by the Cheyenne County PSAP.⁴ As a result, wireless 911 Funding for both Keith County and Cheyenne County need to be adjusted to reflect this change. Based on the current funding model, Commission staff has calculated that

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the pro rata increase in wireless 911 funding to Cheyenne County with respect to the delivery of 911 service to Deuel County is \$221.00 for each the remaining payments in the current funding year.

Based on the foregoing, each of the remaining payments of wireless 911 funding allocated to Cheyenne County for the 2020-2021 funding year should be increased by \$221.00, from \$5,072.00 to 5,293.00.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the remaining payments of wireless 911 funding allocated to Cheyenne County for the 2020-2021 funding year are hereby increased from \$5,072.00 to 5,293.00.
