On or about September 21, 2021, the Clay County public safety answering point ("PSAP") filed a request to use set-aside funds to purchase a Generac 50-kilowatt power generator from Midwest Engine Services. Clay reports the purchase price of the generator is \$24,830.00.

Backup generators are an eligible use of 911 funds.¹ However, 911 funds may only be used to pay the 911 portion of the cost for equipment that is used for multiple purposes.² Clay County reports that ninety-nine percent (99%) of the generator use will be devoted to the PSAP. Therefore, the portion of the purchase price that corresponds to 911 usage is 99% of \$24,830.00, which is \$24,581.70.

Such costs are shared costs subject to the wireless/wireline ratio. The wireless/wireline ratio for Clay County for the 2021-2022 funding year is 76 percent. Therefore, the maximum amount of set-aside funds that Clay County may apply to the cost of the generator is 76 percent of \$24,581.70, which is \$18,682.10.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the request at its October 18, 2021, meeting and recommended the request be approved.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Pursuant to the 911 Service System Act³ (the "Act"), the Commission is responsible for allocating funding to PSAPs from the 911 Service System Fund (the "Fund").⁴ The Fund consists primarily of surcharges collected by wireless carriers from wireless service customers.⁵ The Act provides that money in the fund may be used to pay for costs that are determined by the Public Service Commission ("Commission") to be eligible for funding, including costs incurred by PSAPs for acquisition, installation, maintenance, and operation of telecommunications equipment and services required for the provision of 911 service.⁶

The funding mechanism adopted by the Commission permits PSAPs to set aside up to seventy-five percent (75%) of their annual funding allocation for future purchases of equipment and software. PSAP costs for PSAP power systems are eligible for funding.8

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that use of setaside funding by Clay County should be approved in an amount not to exceed \$18,682.10.
