BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about February 4, 2022, the public safety answering point (PSAP) serving Custer County submitted a funding request seeking reimbursement for costs to implement text to 911 service. The funding request lists \$4,715.50 of costs for one year.

The Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board considered the Custer County PSAP's funding request at its February 10, 2022, meeting and recommended that the Commission approve the funding request.

O P I N I O N S A N D F I N D I N G S

According to Neb. Rev. Stat. 86-1025(5)(c), costs incurred by PSAPs for the acquisition of new equipment and related maintenance costs and license fees, and/or the acquisition, installation, maintenance, and operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications service required for the provision of 911 service may be eligible for funding from the 911 Service System Fund, according to standards and criteria established by the Commission.

On May 6, 2014, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) entered an order on its own motion seeking to investigate and determine whether enhanced wireless 911 surcharge funds should be made available to public safety answering points (PSAPs) to pay the cost of implementing text to 911 solutions.

On November 4, 2014, the Commission entered an Order in this docket, determining that PSAP funding for text to 911 costs would

be paid outside the cost model on an interim basis.¹ On November 19, 2018, the Commission issued a further Order in this docket, concluding that PSAP funding for text-to-911 costs should be continued indefinitely.²

Pursuant to the Orders referenced above, the Commission may approve funding requests for technology solutions and other costs of providing text to 911 services. Based on the foregoing, the Commission finds the funding request submitted by the Custer County PSAP contains eligible costs under the above-referenced Orders, and that funding should be approved in an amount not to exceed **\$4,715.50**.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that funding request for text to 911 costs submitted by Custer County be, and is hereby, approved in an amount not to exceed **\$4,715.50**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Custer County submit documentation to justify all expenditures for payment or reimbursement for such amounts from the 911 Service System Fund.
