O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On March 29, 2006, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-captioned docket, on its own motion, to investigate costs associated with implementing landline enhanced 911 in counties with basic landline 911. Notice of the docket was published in the Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska on April 3, 2006 and sent to all Public Safety Answering Points, Wireless Service Providers, and the Enhanced Wireless 911 Advisory Board.

At the time, seven counties had only basic landline 911 and multiple counties were in the process of implementing enhanced landline 911. The Commission found it necessary to investigate issues associated with implementation of enhanced landline 911 in counties in order to proceed with the implementation of wireless enhanced 911 service statewide.

Currently, all remaining counties have, or are in the process of, implementing enhanced landline and wireless 911. The Commission, therefore, finds that the present investigation is no longer necessary and should be closed.



O R D E R
