BY THE COMMISSION:

By written request for funding received June 14, 2007, Cedar County, Hartington, seeks funding from the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund for expenses of implementing and providing enhanced wireless 911 service related to Viaero.

Cedar County has one public safety answering point (PSAP), which will provide enhanced wireless 911 service throughout Cedar County. The local exchange carrier serving Cedar County's PSAP is Qwest. Cedar County, was previously approved for funding by orders entered on April 2, 2002 for the following wireless carrier: Alltel Wireless and Western Wireless, which has now been acquired by Alltel Wireless. Although, funding was also approved for Nebraska Wireless, a later order entered on October 8, 2002, stated that Nebraska Wireless would no longer be providing service in the area.

Cedar County entered into a service agreement with Qwest for enhanced wireless 911 equipment and services. A copy of the agreement has been provided. In the agreement, Cedar County authorized the Commission to remit all payments for enhanced wireless 911 service, to Qwest.

Cedar County now seeks initial costs and recurring costs to implement and provide enhanced wireless 911 service for Viaero as outlined in Appendix A attached hereto. Initial costs are for database upgrades, trunking infrastructure and purchase, installation, and testing of circuits for enhanced wireless 911. Recurring costs are monthly fees for database management and for operation and maintenance of trunks and circuits.

O P I N I O N       A N D       F I N D I N G S

This request for funding is being processed pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-444 to 86-456 (2006 Cum. Supp.), 291 Neb.

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Admin. Code, Chapter 1, Section 5, and Progression Order No. 5 in Commission Docket No. 911-001, entered July 16, 2002.

Costs requested in the present funding request are eligible under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-86-465(2)(a) (2006 Cum. Supp.). All costs have been incurred or will be incurred for the purchase, installation, maintenance and operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service.

Cedar County has submitted a PSAP registration in compliance with Commission Docket 911-001.

Because Cedar County authorized Qwest to receive all payments on its behalf for wireless enhanced 911, the Commission finds that payment should be made to Qwest consistent with the amounts set forth in Appendix A once implementation is complete. Cedar County shall notify the Commission in writing that implementation has been completed.

Based upon the request for funding and supporting documentation, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the request for funding should be granted.

Information set forth in Appendix A shall be treated as proprietary and confidential.

Payment of all recurring charges shall be made in arrears on a quarterly basis. Payment shall be adjusted based upon the number of subscribers and wireless towers reported quarterly as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-459 (2006 Cum. Supp.). Any adjustments to costs must be approved by the Commission. Additionally, the Commission shall be notified prior to any testing for new tower implementations.

The Commission further finds that Cedar County is on notice and is aware that approval of this funding request is made with the understanding that it may be modified in the future, consistent with the permanent funding mechanism established pursuant to LB 1222 [2006].

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Cedar County's request for funding shall be granted consistent with the terms set forth herein.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission shall remit to Qwest amounts that comport with Appendix A attached hereto once implementation is complete.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that Cedar County is on notice and is aware that approval of this funding request is made with the understanding that it may be modified in the future, consistent with the permanent funding mechanism established pursuant to LB 1222 [2006].
