OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

On March 21, 2016, Saline County filed its application for funding with the Commission pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118. On June 28, 2016, the Commission entered an order approving annual funding for Saline County in the amount of up to \$61,138.66 for the 2016-2017 funding year.¹

Subsequent to the June 28, 2016 Order, the Commission completed an audit for the 2013-2014 funding year. The audit determined that Saline County had set-aside \$481.08 in excess of the maximum 75% of funding that PSAPs are allowed to retain for future equipment and software purchases. Therefore, pursuant to Commission Order, an adjustment was made to reduce Saline County's annual funding in an

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amount equal to such excess, resulting in funding to Saline County for the 2016-2017 funding year in the amount of \$60,657.58.3

The Commission recently completed a review and audit of Saline County for the 2012-2013, 2013-2014, 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 funding years. During such review, it was determined that personnel expenses for dispatchers who receive and process wireless enhanced 911 calls had not been included in the total of the County's expenditures for eligible expenses in the 2012-2013 funding year. However, PSAP costs eligible for wireless enhanced funding had been expanded to include such personnel expenses by Commission Order dated April 17, 2012.4

It is apparent that Saline County incurred eligible personnel expenses exceeding \$481.08 for dispatchers who receive and process wireless enhanced 911 calls during the 2012-2013 funding year. The fact that such eligible expenses were incurred by the PSAP eliminates the need for the adjustment described above.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission finds that funding for Saline County should be modified to increase such funding by an amount equal to \$481.08 for the 2016-2017 funding year. Such amount shall be payable to Saline County as an additional payment prior to the end of the 2016-2017 funding year.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that funding for Saline County is hereby modified by increasing such amount by \$481.08 as set forth herein, resulting in a total of up to \$61,138.66 for the 2016-2017 funding year. Such additional amount shall be payable to Saline County no later than June 30, 2017.
