BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about February 1, 2017, the City of Hastings filed a request with the Public Service Commission ("Commission") seeking retroactive approval of its use of enhanced wireless 911 set aside funds during the 2011-2012 funding year for the purchase of a digital logging recorder at a total cost of \$13,850.68.

The costs sought are shared costs subject to the wireless/wireline ratio. City of Hastings had a wireless ratio for the 2011-2012 funding year of 68% wireless.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the retroactive request at its February 13, 2017, meeting and recommended the request be approved.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Commission adopted the permanent cost model to administer funding for public safety answering points ("PSAPs") for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118. The order establishing the cost model also provides that PSAPs' use of enhanced wireless 911 set aside funds are subject to audit by the Commission.

In the course of an audit of the 2011-2012 funding year, it was determined that on or about April 16, 2012, the City of Hastings reimbursed Adams County for the payment of an invoice in the amount of \$13,850.68 for the purchase of a digital logging recorder. Set aside funds were used to pay \$9,418.46 of the cost, which was the amount eligible to be paid under the then applicable wireless ratio for the City of Hastings.

The City of Hastings failed to seek prior approval to use set-aside funds for the equipment purchase in 2012 as required by Docket No. 911-019/PI-118. The City of Hastings now seeks retroactive approval of this expenditure.

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Based upon the request, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the costs requested are eligible under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-465 as costs have been incurred for the purchase, installation, maintenance or operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service.

The Commission finds that the request of the City of Hastings for retroactive approval of the use of set aside funds for the purchase of equipment. In the future, the City of Hastings should ensure that any funding requests be submitted to the Commission for consideration and approval prior to any expenditure of set aside funds.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the retroactive funding request for City of Hastings is hereby approved in the amount of \$9,418.46.
