BY THE COMMISSION:

On or about August 29, 2013, the Jefferson County filed a request to use the enhanced wireless 911 set aside funds toward the purchase of radio equipment at a total cost of \$14,991.50. Jefferson County is requesting approval to use set aside funding in the amount of \$8,994.90, representing 60% of the total costs based upon wireless call volumes.

The Wireless Enhanced 911 Advisory Board considered the request at its October 21, 2013 meeting and recommended the request be denied as the equipment at issue is not an eligible expense.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) adopted the permanent cost model to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118. Pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism, Jefferson County is receiving a monthly payment in the amount of \$3,828.82.

Based upon the request for funding, supporting documentation, and in consideration of the recommendation of the Advisory Board, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that a the costs requested are not eligible under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-465 as costs incurred for the purchase, installation, maintenance or operation of telecommunications equipment and telecommunications services required for the provision of enhanced wireless 911 service.¹
