O P I N I O N       A N D       F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

On April 15, 2011, Keya Paha County (Keya Paha) filed its application for funding with the Commission pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

Keya Paha, which provides services for Keya Paha County, is eligible for funding in the amount of \$22,281.37 for the 2011-2012 funding year. Keya Paha has indicated that it anticipates using the funding provided for the following purposes: future purchase of 911 hardware and software, support GIS contracts and map updates, other equipment, training, software and services to assist in the provision of wireless enhanced 911, and plans to set aside 75% of its funding for future equipment and software purchases.

Keya Paha has not yet implemented enhanced wireless 911 but is in the process of doing so. As such, no payment can be made to the county until such implementation is completed. The eligible funding will be prorated based upon the date of implementation and the county will not receive the full allocation.

Prior funding commitments in the amount of \$11,419.98 were previously approved and must be deducted from the allocation.

Based upon the above, the Commission finds that the funding request for Keya Paha County in the amount of up to \$10,861.39, should be approved consistent with the allocation determined in Docket 911-019/PI-118. Payments of a prorated amount will

commence once implementation of wireless enhanced 911 services is complete. Keya Paha County is responsible for notifying the Commission once implementation has taken place.

Pursuant to Docket 911-019/PI-118, Keya Paha is required to submit documentation to justify expenditures, including an accounting of funds set aside for future equipment and software purchases, and update contact and other information no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year. If the Commission determines that any funds were not used appropriately, funding for the following funding year will be adjusted to recoup any necessary funds. All PSAPs are subject to audit.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for Keya Paha County is hereby approved as set forth herein in the amount of up to \$10,861.39.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that payments of a prorated amount will commence once implementation of wireless enhanced 911 service has occurred and Keya Paha County has notified the Commission.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that Keya Paha County submit required documentation to justify all expenditures with approved funds no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with the terms of the order approving the permanent funding mechanism and process in Docket 911-019/PI-118 entered on February 23, 2010.
