O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

The purpose of an order nunc pro tunc is to correct the record which has been made so that it will truly record the action taken which, through inadvertence or mistake, was not truly recorded.¹ Clerical errors may be corrected by an order nunc pro tunc, but not judicial errors.²

On December 8, 2015, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) entered an order approving funding for Otoe County pursuant to a funding request that Otoe County filed with the Commission on June 30, 2015.

Due to a clerical error, the order incorrectly stated on page three that Nemaha County was permitted to use set-aside funds up to \$91,495.36 for eligible non-recurring costs. The order should have stated that Otoe County was permitted to use set-aside funds up to \$91,495.36 for eligible non-recurring costs.

Based on the above, the Commission finds that the December 8, 2015 order should be corrected to reference Otoe County instead of Nemaha County. The remainder of the December 8, 2015 order remains unchanged and in full effect.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the December 8, 2015 order should be corrected as set forth herein.
