O P I N I O N      A N D      F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-mentioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for public safety answering points for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism.<sup>1</sup>

EDS 911 provides enhanced 911 service on behalf of Franklin County and began receiving interim funding in the amount of \$19,122.86 for the 2012-13 funding year. This amount reflects the deduction of pre-existing commitments totaling \$6,444.00. Interim payments were made with the understanding that any adjustments made as a result of issues being considered in Docket No. 911-019/PI-118<sup>2</sup> would be retroactive to July 1, 2012.

On September 18, 2012, the Commission entered an order in Docket No. 911-019/PI-118 resolving the outstanding issues resulting in adjustments to PSAP funding.<sup>3</sup> Based upon those adjustments and the modification of certain pre-existing payments for some PSAPs, the Commission finds that EDS 911 is approved for

a total funding amount of \$46,530.92 for the 2012-2013 funding year. An adjustment was made in the amount of \$3,476.88 to account for amounts already received for the current funding year. An additional adjustment was made in the amount of \$3,717.00 in pre-existing commitments for the 2012-2013 funding year. A month's allocation in the amount of \$4,370.78 was deducted as the PSAP failed to timely file its application for funding. Although amounts were paid on behalf of the PSAP during the 2010-2011 funding year, the PSAP did not implement Phase II wireless 911 service until April 2011 and was therefore not receiving a monthly allocation until that time.<sup>4</sup> As a result a pro-rated deduction was made for amounts paid on the PSAP's behalf that year. Calculations for individual PSAPs are available via the Commission's website.

Therefore, EDS 911 shall receive a total of \$34,966.25 to be paid in monthly installments in the amount of \$3,885.14 for the remaining nine (9) months of the 2012-2013 funding year.

EDS 911 is required to submit documentation to justify expenditures, including an accounting of funds set aside for future equipment and software purchases, and update contact and other information no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with Neb. Admin. Code, Title 291, Ch. 15 § 008. If the Commission determines that any funds were not used appropriately, funding for the following funding year will be adjusted to recoup any necessary funds. All PSAPs are subject to audit.

#### O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding for the EDS 911 is hereby adjusted as set forth herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that EDS 911 must submit required documentation to justify all expenditures with approved funds no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year consistent with Neb. Admin. Code, Title 291, Ch. 15 § 008.




