## BY THE COMMISSION:

## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-captioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for wireless service providers for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

Sprint/Nextel (Sprint) filed an application for funding pursuant to Docket No. 911019/PI-118. Pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism, Sprint has been allocated an amount up to \$370,541 paid in monthly installments of \$30,878.42. Sprint, provides service throughout Nebraska in several counties and states that the funds will be used for database costs, administration, local exchange carrier costs and engineering. Sprint has submitted estimates of the costs it expects to incur during the funding year in the amount of \$216,264.00. These costs are significantly less than Sprint's allocation.

The Commission finds that the funding request for Sprint in the amount of \$216,264.00 paid in monthly installments of \$18,022.00 should be approved. Should Sprint find during the funding year, that its eligible costs are higher than its estimate, it should request that the funding be increased in an amount to cover such costs, not to exceed the allocated amount.

Pursuant to Docket 911-019/PI-118, Sprint is required to submit documentation to justify expenditures and update contact and other information no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year. If the Commission determines that any funds were not used appropriately, funding for the following funding year would be adjusted to recoup any necessary funds. All wireless service providers are subject to audit.

Any wireless service provider failing to file timely and accurate quarterly reports may be subject to delays or loss of funding in addition to any other administrative penalties.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for Sprint is hereby approved in the amount of \$216,264.00.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Sprint shall submit required documentation to justify all expenditures with approved funds no later than October 15 following the close of the funding year.
