O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On or about March 30, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-captioned docket, on its own motion, seeking to administer funding for wireless service providers for the implementation and provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 service pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism approved under Docket No. 911-019/PI-118.

Annual applications for funding are due to the Commission by April 15th pursuant to Docket No. 911-019/PI-118. On March 28th, 2014, Sprint filed an application for funding.

Pursuant to the permanent funding mechanism, Sprint has been allocated an amount up to \$176,427.97. Sprint states that the funds will be used for recurring monthly costs for enhanced wireless 911 related services provided by Intrado, administrative costs, and facilities costs. Sprint has submitted estimates of the costs it expects to incur during the funding year in the amount of \$113,076.00. These costs are significantly less than Sprint's allocation.

The Commission finds that the funding request for Sprint in the amount of up to \$113,076.00 should be approved. Amounts shall be paid no more than monthly in arrears based upon receipt of documentation filed by Sprint for expenses incurred. During the funding year, should Sprint find that its eligible costs are higher than its estimate or additional uses not described in their annual application, it should submit an amended application request to increase funding in an amount to cover such costs, not to exceed the allocated amount, or include additional eligible expenses.

Pursuant to Docket 911-019/PI-118, expenses for which reimbursement is sought must have been incurred during the current funding year and must be consistent with the expenses

identified in Sprint's application. Documentation supporting eligible expenditures should be submitted by the 7th of the month in order to receive payment by the end of the month. Payment will be made no later than the end of the month following the receipt of the request, as long as proper documentation is received with the request in a timely manner.

Any wireless service provider failing to file timely and accurate quarterly reports may be subject to delays or loss of funding in addition to any other administrative penalties. All wireless service providers are subject to audit.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the funding request for Sprint is hereby approved in the amount of up to \$113,076.00 paid in accordance with the terms set forth herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Sprint request funds by filing documentation supporting eligible expenditures by the 7th of the month in order to receive payment by the end of the month.
