OPINION AND FINDINGS

On June 2nd, 2010, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above-captioned docket on its own motion seeking to investigate the requirements, costs and impact of the implementation of IP based Next Generation 911 (Next Gen 911) in Nebraska relating to the provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 Service. Under this docket the Commission received comments, held a workshop, and gathered evidence, which was used in assisting the Legislature with the passage of LB595 (2013).

LB595 directed the Commission to study the statewide implementation of Next Generation 911 and allowed the use of the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund for associated costs. LB595 became effective May $8^{\rm th}$, 2013.

On June $4^{\rm th}$, 2013, the Commission opened Docket No. 911-058/PI-188 to conduct a study examining issues surrounding statewide implementation of next-generation 911 pursuant to LB595 (2013). The issue of Next Generation 911 has been subsumed by Docket No. 911-058/PI-188. The Commission, therefore, finds that the present investigation is no longer necessary and should be closed.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the above-captioned investigation be closed.
